Parents,

Thank you for getting the students in the testing grades to school on time. We have finished testing and now we are awaiting the results. We feel confident that our students will have passing scores. First Grade News

As the 2016-2017 school year comes to an end, the first grade students are constantly focusing on their skills in order to get ready for second grade.

In reading we are using illustrations to tell a story, identify who is telling the story and comparing and contrasting two texts. In social studies, we are studying historical figures and their character traits. In science we are studying light, sound and heat energy. Lastly, in math we are studying 2 and 3 dimensional shapes. Please continue to assist your child with studying their sight words, math fluency facts and read with your child at least 20 minutes every night.

The first grade teachers are very proud of the efforts and achievements the students have made this school year.

We have made it to the end of the school year! We will be closing out our semester with fun filled activities and instructional review. Please save the following dates to your calendar as they do pertain to second grade. Progress reports were sent home on the last week in April, please see your scholar's teacher if you have not received them. We will begin our final benchmark testing beginning the first week in May. Please continue to work with your child at home on skills that are on their homework sheets.
