Here in kindergarten we are continuing to learn about the letters of the alphabet, numbers in math, science and social studies. We have learned the letters t, b, f, m, n, o, c, a, g, w, v, y, and x. We are also learning to count numbers 1- 100 with a current focus on comparing numbers using <, >, and = signs. In science, we are learning about day and night and their differences and similarities. Can you count to one hundred by tens?

Grade Two News

Our students have engaged in many challenging and rewarding learning experiences and there's more to come! In the month of December, 2nd graders will continue to look at characters in literature and how they respond to major events in the plot. We will also focus on describing and making connections in informational texts. In math, the students will continue to build on concepts learned last year in 1st grade and become more fluent in addition and subtraction. In science, we are learning about stars and in social studies we are learning about Georgia's first people the Native Americans. Please be involved in your child's education by checking their homework, attendance and academic progress often. Make attending school meetings, events, and parent-teacher conferences a priority. Ask teachers if you can help them find educational materials and resources that they need and, if you have time, help the teacher in the classroom.

Grade Three News

Greetings parents, the third graders at Humphries Elementary are progressing daily. The team is working hard to ensure students' success. Over the next two months the students will be working on the skills listed below. We ask that you continue to reinforce skills at home by completing homework with your child, practice basic math multiplication facts, reading daily, and encouraging positive behavior. In reading we are working on point of view and informative and explanatory writing. In math we are learning to multiply and divide, and in science we are studying how humans affect the environment. Finally, in social studies we are learning how American Indians contributed to our overall American culture.

Grade Five News

It is hard to believe that we have completed four months of school. Our students are working hard to meet and exceed content expectations. In math students will be working with decimal operations. This is a perfect time to have conversations around money. Students will also be studying the Great Depression and World War I, and exploring chemical and physical changes in Science. Reading a variety of texts are helping students to build vocabulary, enhance comprehension and reading stamina, and improve fluency. Please encourage your child to stay focused, follow school rules, and complete all assignments in a timely fashion. Looking forward to a great 2019!

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Enrichment Team

In Art we will be working on a variety of art activities during the months of December and January. 5th graders will be working on drawing people and using those drawings to create different types of people art. 4th graders will be painting and learning about the primary, secondary, and intermediate colors so that they can colorful gardens, monochromatic seascapes, and other artworks of the natural environment. The 3rd graders will also be creating people art and learning about proportion. In addition they will create a sculpture of a person. 2nd graders will be learning about color groups and primary and secondary colors. They will be painting a colorful garden focusing on mixing primary colors to make secondary colors. They will also begin using lines and colors to show motion in their work. 1st grade will learn about free-forms and create a food collage using foods that they like to eat and things that they find in the kitchen. They will move on to learn about textures by creating crayon rubbings. Kindergarten will learn to use art materials in different ways. They will learn techniques for tearing paper to create art and the proper way to use scissors to make cut paper art as well as how to use a paintbrush and paint.

In Music the students will rehearse, evaluate and refine musical performances to present a successful performance for the upcoming Winter Program. During class, students will evaluate and refine personal and ensemble performances, individually or in collaboration with others.

In Physical Education, students will continue to focus on demonstrating understanding of movement concepts, principles, strategies, and tactics as they apply to the learning and performance of physical activities. Students will also have an opportunity to work on different objectcontrol skills. Also, for the next few weeks will focus on skills related to basketball and jump roping!

This was certainly a busy and exciting fall at Humphries Elementary! Students celebrated having drug free futures during Red Ribbon Week in October and then learned all about jobs and careers during College and Career Motivation Week in November.
