### A. Principal Report

- Principal Sofianos Presentation on data and how the data is used to create and update strategic priorities and improvement plan, testing scores and school capacity and attendance.
- Presentation can be found on GO Team webpage.
- Review of the continuous improvement plan for APS the data that drives the goals and the strategic priorities which are used to develop the strategic improvement plan
- The strategic improvement plan is very focused on map scores and the Georgia Milestones and how we move our learners forward to become distinguished learners
- Strengths and challenges – as a school the Georgia Milestones is a key indicator of success, we saw good increases in ELA/Math
- MES has the highest attendance which we continue to maintain
- The key challenge is the 25% of students that stay stagnant in beginner and developing
- MES does have achievement gaps and focus is on how to propel and sustain student achievement in the subgroups that show gaps
- There has been an increase in students falling in the elevated level on the BASC – so identifying and working with these students is a priority
- Have looked at the implementation of the new math program as well as how the reading block is being used to ensure that we're working toward the goals
- Took a look at kindergarten data – found the only attendance correlation with students is in Kindergarten – those with increased absences had gaps in foundational skills
- Planning additional literacy and math integrated opportunities
- Discussion followed on test scores and different ways to collect and monitor data
- Principal Sofianos presented Kindergarten data – based on GKids assessment
- Continued to look at data from last year to this year
- Reviewed and discussed MAP scores winter to spring
- Reviewed and discussed subgroup data
- Principal Sofianos reviewed the Strategic Priorities Ranking
