Final adoption of FY 2018 Budgets: General Fund, Fund 150, Special Revenue Fund, Capital
Projects Fund, School Nutrition Fund, Debt Service Fund and Student Activity Fund

It was moved by Jason Esteves and seconded by Steven Lee to approve the FY 2018 Budget with total appropriation amounts as presented: General Fund \$518,112,162 (Five Hundred Eighteen Million, One Hundred Sixty Tow Dollars(, Fund 150 \$259,255,333 (Two Hundred Fifty Nine Million, Two Hundred Fifty Five Thousand, Three Hundred Thirty Three Dollars), Special Revenue Fund \$59,251,342 (Fifty Nine Million, Two Hundred fifty One Thousand, Three Hundred Forty Two Dollars), Capital Projects Fund \$125,965,698 (One Hundred Twenty Five Million, Nine Hundred Sixty Five Thousand, Six Hundred Ninety Eight Dollars), School nutrition Fund (\$31,878,511 (Thirty One Million, Eight Hundred Seventy Eight Thousand, Five Hundred Eleven Dollars), Debt Service fund \$0 (Zero Dollars), and Student Activity Fund \$5,500,000 ( Five Million, Five Hundred Thousand Dollars). The total appropriations for all funds is \$999,963,046 (nine Hundred Ninety Nine Million, Nine Hundred Sixty Three Thousand m Forty Six Dollars). Also any remaining funds as of June 30, 2017 earmarked for Application, Software and License Support, as well as for teacher stipends earmarked for summer work, warehouse vans, and leadership development may be carried forward to the FY 2018 budget as of July 1, 2017 for the same purposes. Additionally, a provision is also recommended for action relate to the FY 2018 Budget Adoption. The provision states: in the General Fund, sustenance that is non-instructional in nature may only be funded with non-tax revenue.
