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Meeting summary for Christina Rogers's Personal Meeting Room (5/7/2025)

Quick recap

The team discussed the implementation of school uniforms for the upcoming school year, with a focus on wearing plain black hoodies over polo shirts, and the introduction of cell phone pouches and lockers. - Mr. Gilliam to visit Midtown High School to observe their cell phone pouch system and report back to Dr. Rogers.
- Dr. Rogers to work on acquiring additional plain shirts for students out of uniform next school year.
- Miss Collins or someone in the media center to create a video demonstrating the new cell phone pouch system for students before the end of the current school year.
- Go Team members to help identify parents interested in reactivating the PTSA.
- Dr. Rogers to determine the school day schedule for May 22nd, considering the 3 PM graduation at McCamish Pavilion.

Summary

Teacher Appreciation Week and Quorum Discussion

In the meeting, Christina expressed her readiness for the last meeting of the school year. She mentioned that the 10th grade team had been doing well and set a high standard for the 9th graders. Natalie shared her positive experience with the 10th graders and mentioned that they had been a great help. The team discussed the upcoming Teacher Appreciation week, with a Western theme. They also discussed the possibility of having a quorum for the meeting, with some members still waiting to join.

Senior Prank and Go Team Meeting

In the meeting, Christina discussed a prank pulled by the seniors, which involved a staged walkout and use of the intercom. The pranksters also moved furniture and blocked off the building. The pranksters were praised for their organization and execution. The meeting then proceeded to discuss the agenda for the Go team meeting, with Joi volunteering to preside over the meeting. The team confirmed their attendance and established quorum.

Uniform Policy and Tracking System

In the meeting, the agenda was approved, and the minutes from the previous meeting were discussed. The main topic of discussion was the implementation of school uniforms for the upcoming school year.
