




Amazing things we saw

- Increased (intentional) vocabulary focus
 - Explicit vocabulary instruction (indicated on lesson plans & executed during live instruction)
 - Gradual increase of reinforcement of daily "word of the day" from morning announcements as a way to minimize student gaps in word exposure








Be sure that formative assessments links are working/accesible.

- Close reading strategies should be incorporated anytime that reading is taking place; should be indicated on all plans (find ways to incorporate it; at the very minimum, plans should indicate that students will read and annotate all assignment instructions).
- FYI-Moving forward, I will report 2 sets of metrics: lesson plan metrics and class observattion metrics.

ACTION STEPS: MONITOR THE EFFECTIVENESS OF INTERVENTION SUPPORT AND PROGRESS MONITORING FOR TIER 2 AND 3

<u>Implementation goal</u>

Flex Tier 3- Interventionist actively engaged with instructional intervention support and progress monitoring executed with fidelity daily/weekly and entered in IC.

Friday-Tier 2 Teachers provide tier 2 instructional skills and progress monitoring fusing IXL for math and reading (forthcoming). Tier 2 Teachers will enter progress monitoring data in IC weekly.







We utilize Liveschool as a means of reminding students of our expectations and rewarding them.




