

- International Baccalaureate Diploma Program: courses taken in 11th and 12th grade to complete diploma program
- International Baccalaureate Career-Related Program: combines two+ IB Diploma Program courses with a complete career-related pathway of study
- Early College (Dual Enrollment): attend a public college to earn high school and college credit simultaneously, course fees, books, and fees paid by program. Student must apply and be accepted to college.
- On-Level/Honors/Advanced Placement: college level courses available to all students beginning in 9th grade

AP Computer Science Principles

New in 2019-2020! AP CSP is designed to be equivalent to a first-semester introductory college computing course, and offers a multidisciplinary approach to teaching the underlying principles of computation. The course will introduce students to the creative aspects of programming, abstractions, algorithms, large data sets, the Internet, cybersecurity concerns, and computing impacts. Requires strong math skills and a love of creative problem-solving.

While not officially a pathway, AP CSP will be the first in a progressive series of Computer Science courses offered through a new partnership with Georgia Tech.
