Degree Programs & Academic Options

- International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IBDP): courses taken in 11th and 12th grade to complete Diploma Program. Most rigorous academic path.
- International Baccalaureate Career-Related Program (IBCP): combines two or more IB Diploma Program courses with a complete career-related pathway of study.
- Advanced Placement (AP)/Honors/On-Level: students can pursue any mix of these courses. AP are college-level courses available to *all* students beginning in 9th grade.
- Early College (Dual Enrollment): attend a public college to earn high school and college credit simultaneously; course fees, books, etc. are paid by program. Student must apply and be accepted to college.

AP CSP is designed to be equivalent to a first-semester introductory college computing course, and offers a multidisciplinary approach to teaching the underlying principles of computation. The course will introduce students to the creative aspects of programming, abstractions, algorithms, large data sets, the Internet, cybersecurity concerns, and computing impacts. Requires strong math skills and a love of creative problem-solving.

While not officially a pathway, AP CSP will be the first in a progressive series of Computer Science courses offered through a new partnership with Georgia Tech.

- Take AP classes starting in ninth grade. Don't be scared of rigor. Exposure is valuable.
- YOUR DAILY ACTIONS/HABITS affect your future! The transcript that you are sending to colleges starts on the first day of 9th grade and ends in Spring of 12th grade.


How can parents assist with student success at the high school level?
