Our students will be well rounded individuals who possess the necessary academic skills and knowledge and are excited about learning.

School Goals

Parkside administrators and Leadership Team have studied our performance data to decide the most important areas of improvement for our school.

- Increase the number of students performing at proficient level by 10% on the Spring 2023 administration of the MAP Assessments for students in Grades K-2.
- Increase the number of students performing at the proficient level by 10% on the 2023 administration of the GA Milestones Assessments for grades 3-5.

Parkside Staff



The teachers, specialists and support staff at Parkside will work with students and their families to develop the students' Mathematical and Reading competency according to grade level standards. The focus of our key connections with families will be:

- Provide parents with a variety of math and reading strategies that meet Common Core Standards. Examples of each will be provided through newsletters, homework and classroom parent meetings or conferences.
- Teach students and parents how to use a variety of strategies through grade level Curriculum Nights and virtual meetings in order to expose parents to Georgia Standards of Excellence.

Classroom Student Goals



Student Math Goals

- To increase the number of students in grades K-2 who score at the proficient level or higher in the area of Math on the spring 2023 administration of the MAP assessment by 5% from the fall 2022 administration of the MAP assessment.
- To increase the number of students in grades 3-5 who score at the proficient level or higher in the area of Math on the spring 2023 administration of the GMAS by 3% from 35% in Spring 2022 to 38% in Spring 2023.
- Focus: Fluency and Number Sense

Student Reading/ ELA Goals

- To increase the number of students in grades K-2 who score at the proficient level or higher in the area of Reading/ELA on the Spring 2021 administration of the MAP assessment by 5% from the fall 2022 administration of the MAP assessment.
- To increase the number of students in grades 3-5 who score at the proficient level or higher in the area of Reading/ELA on the Spring 2023 administration of the GMAS by 3% from 43% in Spring of 2023 to 46% in Spring 2023.
- Focus: Vocabulary, Comprehension, and Writing

At Home



Families can support student's math and Reading understanding by:

- Use academic based games at home to help your child in Math, and Reading comprehension.
- Help your child develop a love of reading by reading with them at home for at least 20 minutes each day.
- Attend Curriculum and Grade Level Nights.
