- The percentage of students in grades 9-12 scoring proficient or above in math will increase from 51.9% % to 56.9% in June 2023.

Student Academic Agreement

Students agree to do the following to grow academically and be successful:

- ◆ Attend multiple remediation and academic tutoring and Saturday sessions to improve End of Course (EOC) and Georgia Milestones Tests
- ◆ Participate in math, science and reading activities to enhance problem solving skills and participate in school fairs
- ◆ Seek academic assistance when their grades fall to a 75 average or below
- ◆ Utilize advisement and counselor to get career, college and academic assistance
- ◆ Utilize peer tutors to increase math and English Language Arts (ELA) skills and ensure success on the EOC Georgia Milestones exams

Teacher Academic Agreement

Teachers agree to do the following to encourage academic success:

- ◆ Provide meaningful, engaging instruction daily
- ◆ Provide students with tutorial sessions for necessary academic remediation and recovery
- ◆ Encourage students with regular progress reports and ways of improvement
- ◆ Provide parents with opportunities to observe and volunteer in classroom activities
- ◆ Provide parents with regular updates of students progress in study areas via Parent Portal and upon request
- ◆ Immediately contact parents/guardians of students needing improvement

Parent Academic Agreement
