Dear Parent(s) or Guardian(s):

During the 2020-2021 school year, The Atlanta Public School System (APS) will administer the PSAT/NMSQT to all 11<sup>th</sup> grade students who opt to sit for the assessment and a limited number of 10<sup>th</sup> grade students on Tuesday, January 26, 2021. PSAT/NMSQT administration is an annual decision and testing for 10<sup>th</sup> graders is not guaranteed this year. Students in 11<sup>th</sup> grade will receive priority slots for testing; and a final decision to administer the assessment to 10<sup>th</sup> graders will be based on the total number of opt in responses from both grade levels. It will also be based on our school's ability to adhere to staffing needs and APS COVID-19 safety guidelines. We will announce our ability to approve or decline 10<sup>th</sup> grade participation requests by Friday, January 15<sup>th</sup>.

We ask that all parents complete the [D. M. Therrell High School PSAT/NMSQT Opt-In Form](#) by January 6<sup>th</sup> to register their student for the January 26<sup>th</sup> administration of the PSAT/NMSQT. Failure to complete the form will exclude your student from testing. Atlanta Public Schools allocated funds to pay the costs of 2020-2021 PSAT/NMSQT exam fees for 11<sup>th</sup> graders and the Georgia Department of Education (GaDOE) will pay for 10<sup>th</sup> grade students.

We are asking parents/guardians to be reflective about their desire to have their child complete the assessment in a face to face setting; and trust that each family will make a decision that best fits the needs of their individual child and the safety of the community. This link provides important test details, familiarizes students with question types, and information on the National Merit Scholarship Program.

College Board has not made provisions for a virtual test administration of the PSAT; therefore, **it is the expectation that APS provides a safe and secure testing environment for students who would like to participate.** With that, the PSAT/NMSQT test will be administered face to face at each high school. Below outlines APS's PSAT/NMSQT test administration process.

#### **PSAT/NMSQT Administration Process:**

1. Parents/Guardians must complete the [D. M. Therrell High School PSAT/NMSQT Opt-In Form](#) by January 6<sup>th</sup> to register their student for the January 26<sup>th</sup> administration of the PSAT/NMSQT.
2. Students must test at their home school.
3. APS will provide meals and transportation for students who request them on the form.
4. Communication regarding 10<sup>th</sup> grade participation, transportation and testing room assignments will be communicated via calling post, phone call, Email, Remind, etc. Please ensure accurate contact information is included on the opt-in form.
5. Student must wear face covering or mask for the entire test administration.

\*\*The Atlanta Public School System will follow all Georgia Health Department and the Center for Disease Control Health and Safety Guidelines as related to the COVID-19 pandemic. \*\*

**\*\*If students are showing signs of fever, cough, runny nose, chills, or any other cold-like symptoms, they should not participate in this administration. \*\***
