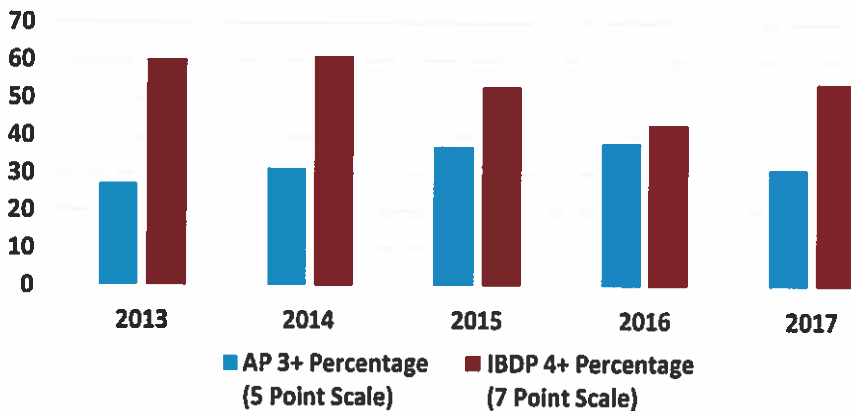

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Career-related Programme (CP)

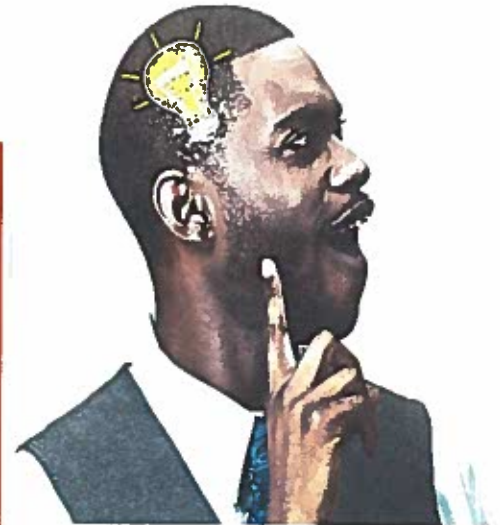

MYP

The MYP requires at least 50 hours of teaching time for each subject group in each year of the programme. In years 4 and 5, students have the option to take courses from six of the eight subject groups within certain limits, to provide greater flexibility in meeting local requirements and individual student learning needs. The six subject groups offered at D.M. Therrell are Language Acquisition, Language & Literature, Individuals & Societies, Sciences, Mathematics, and Performing Arts.

Each year, students in the MYP also engage in at least one collaboratively planned interdisciplinary unit that involves at least two subject groups.
