

Soar: Stress On Analytical Reasoning is a residential 3-week program hosted by Xavier University of Louisiana, that prepares high school seniors in analytical reasoning and provides early exposure to college life and science and health careers. In addition to participating in thought provoking courses and laboratory practicums, participants will have the opportunity to explore the cultural richness of New Orleans through field trips and activities. A limited number of on-campus housing is available for SOAR participants living outside of the New Orleans Metropolitan Area. The program runs July 1-20, 2018.



Application Process and Checklist:

To be considered ALL of the following items MUST be submitted

- 1. Rising High School Seniors (at least 16 years old by July 1st)
- 2. Completed On-line application deadline: April 20, 2018
- 3. One recommendation form completed by your counselor, teacher or principal who knows your character and work.
- 4. A copy of your PSAT, ACT, or SAT test scores. (required)
- 5. A copy of your high school transcript.

Accepted Students Requirements:

- Submit a \$300 non-refundable program deposit by May 4, 2018.
- Submit signed acceptance packet and final payment by deadline.

Program Cost and Scholarships:

Students will be housed on campus from July 1-20. Cost include housing, daily meals and snacks, trips, course materials, t-shirt and bookbag.

- Program Cost: \$1,000 for residential students, \$700 for commuter students
- Financial based scholarships are available by request and with a completed application by March 30, 2018.

Move-Out: Friday, July 20, between 1pm-8pm (Residential students only)
