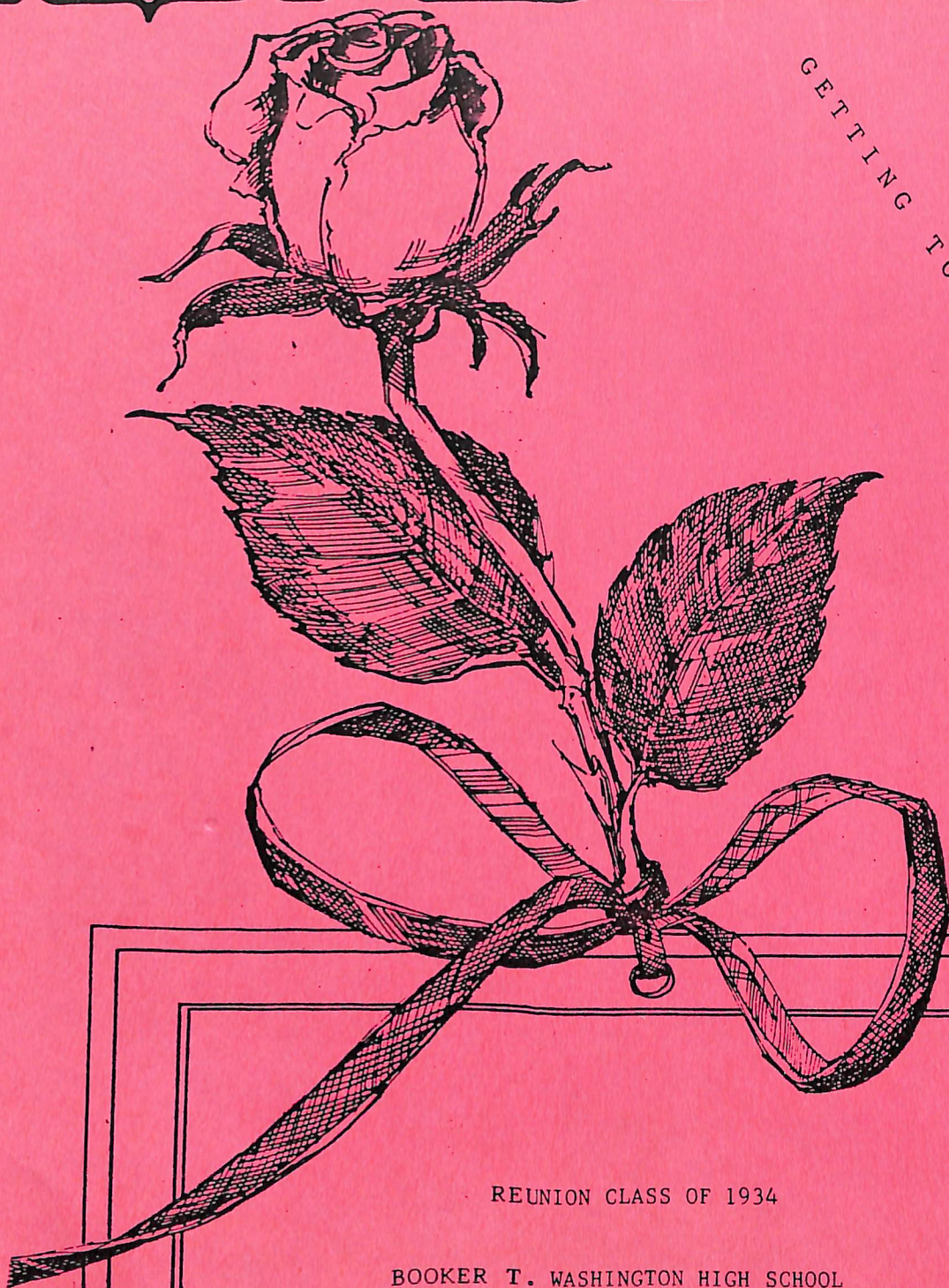

CLASS '34 HAS BRILLIANT HISTORY

In the year of 1931, September 7, a group of about 102 girls and boys were assembled in various sections of the 10th grade. The year 1931 being their first year in the Senior Department, the students were required to donate their time, energy and mind to their studies. In 1932 they were promoted to 10th high. During the whole term each of the students were under very careful instruction.

In the year of 1932, September 7, this same group of young people were again assembled in various sections of the 11th grade, only with an additional number. A number of students came from various parts of Georgia, Alabama, Texas and South Carolina to attend the Junior class of Booker T. Washington High. Since it has been the occasion for the past 10 years that the Juniors entertain the Seniors in some respect, the Juniors were called together in order to organize. The president was elected, also other necessary officers.

This being done, the class was able to get better cooperation from all the students. The Juniors entertained the senior class by giving a "prom" on the Roof Garden which will always be remembered by both Juniors and Seniors. In 1933, over half of the students who qualified to make the trip to the World's Fair, were taken from the Junior Class.

In the year of 1933, September 7, this same group of boys and girls with a larger number, were assembled together in various sections to begin their Senior class work also, their last year's work at B. T. Washington High School. Every student started the year off with a smile, also a dignified air about them in order to set an example for the on coming classes. The year 1933 was devoted to hard studying. The year 1934 the honor trip to Washington finds over half of the students taking the trip were seniors.

On June 1, 325 qualified seniors were to graduate, the largest class in the past ten years, since the opening of Booker T. Washington High School in the year of 1924.


