"Books with all their contents, are not an end, but a means to an end, a means to help us get the highest, the best, the purest and the most beautiful things out of life."

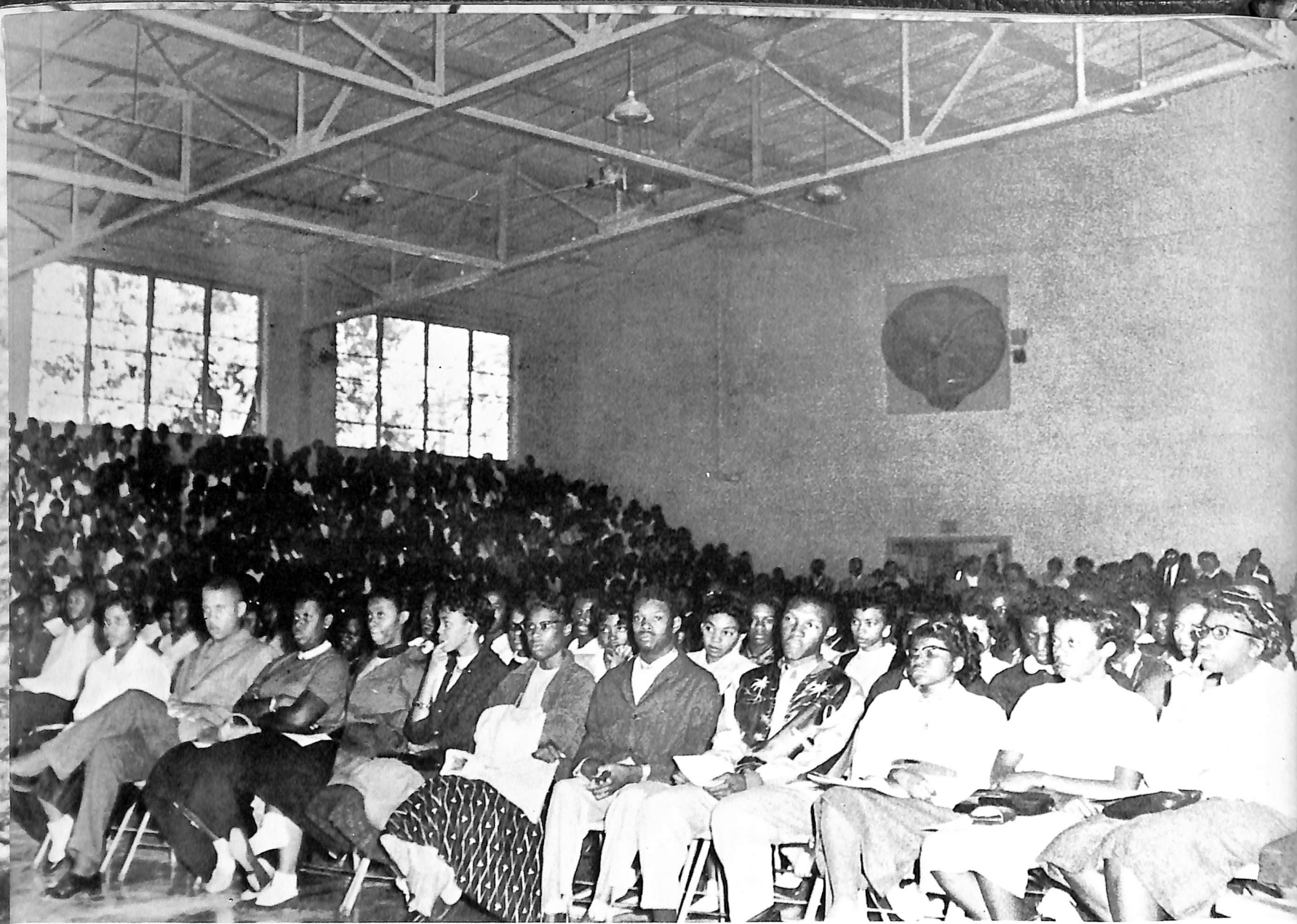

For a number of years Mr. Jackson was bandmaster and instructor in music in Washington High School, during which time he composed the music for the school song—Washington, O Washington!

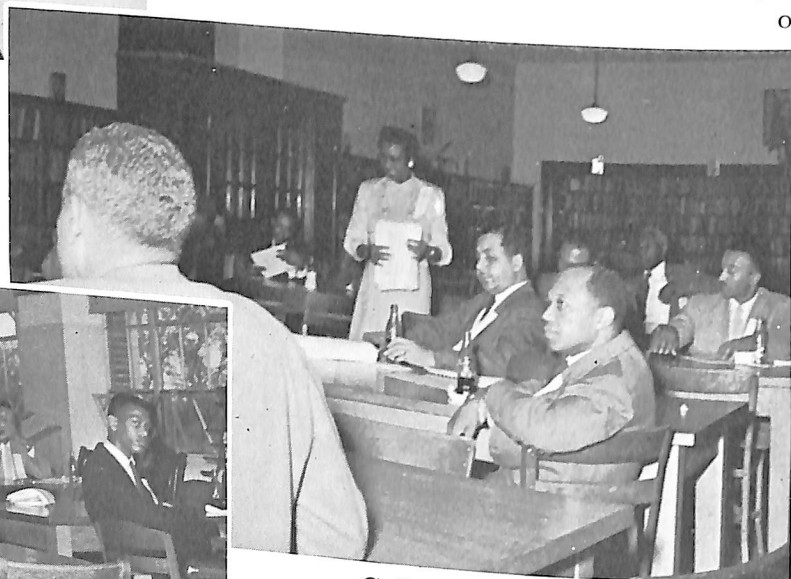

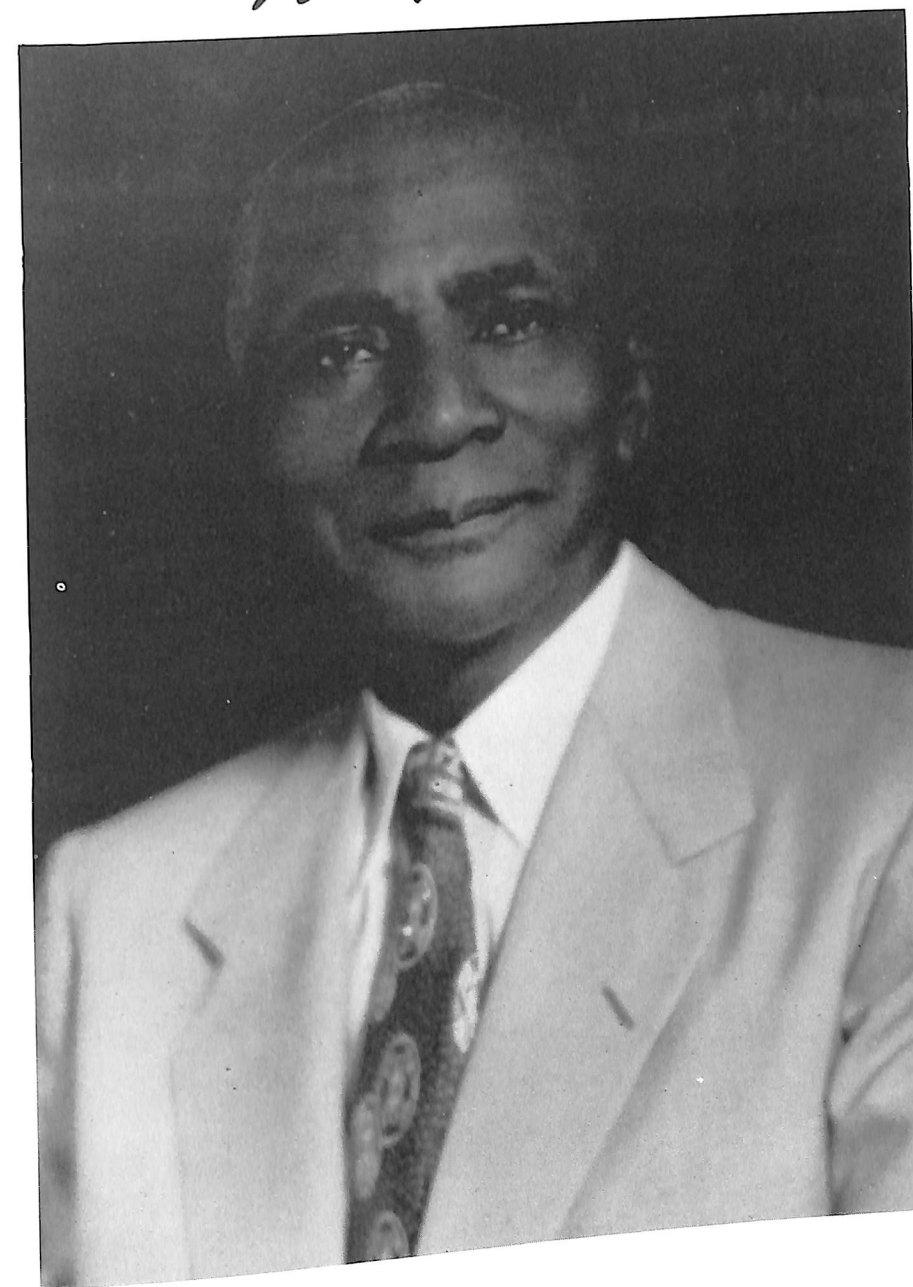

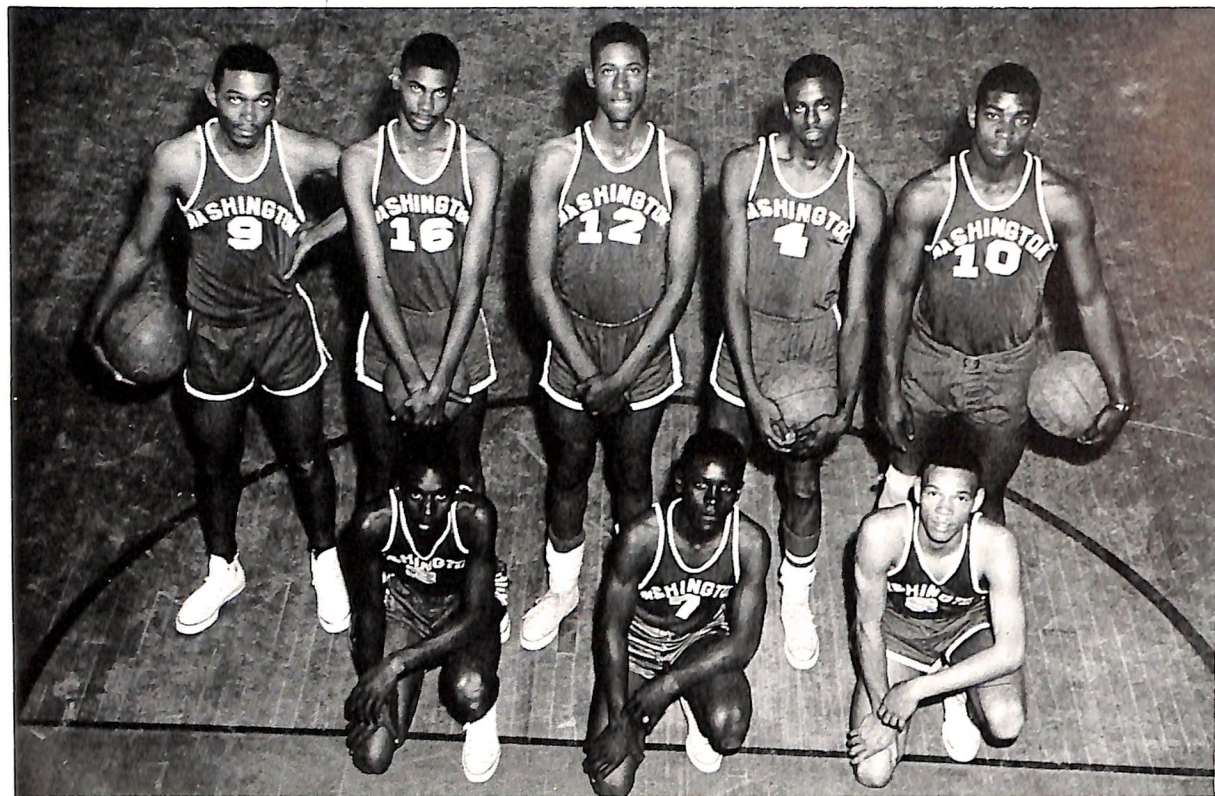

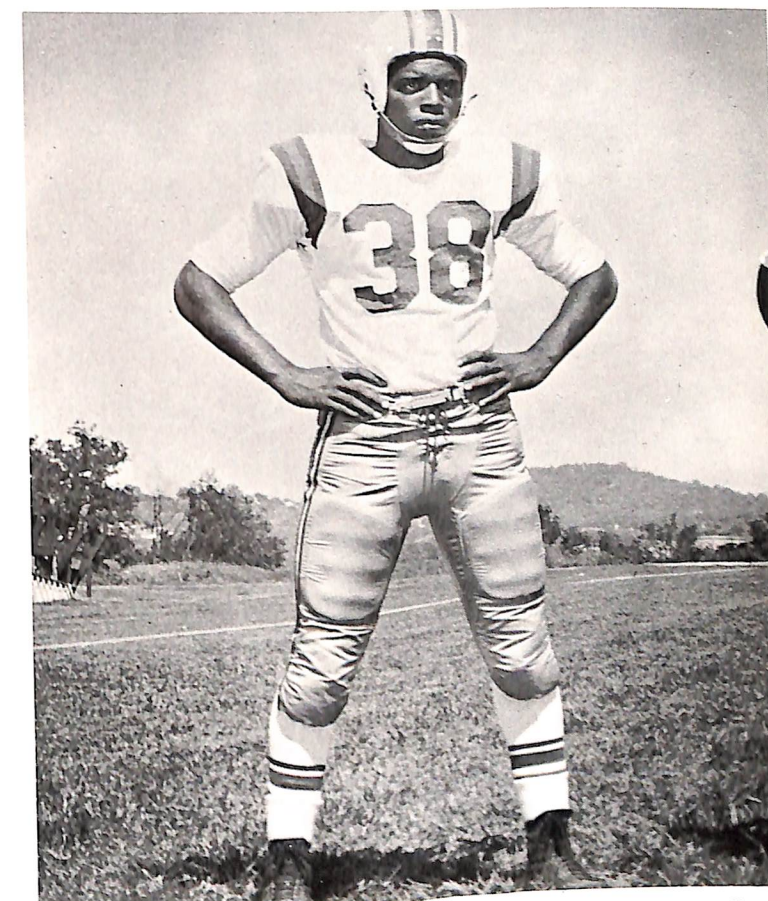
