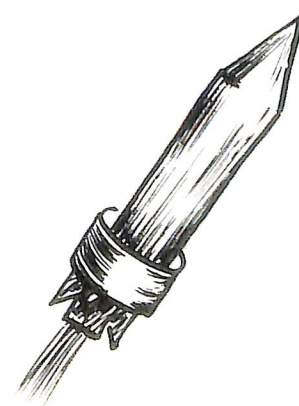

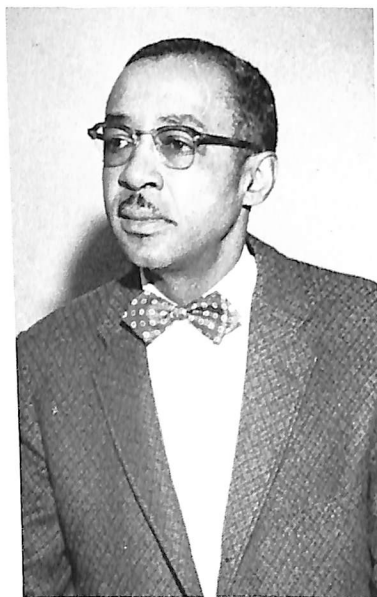

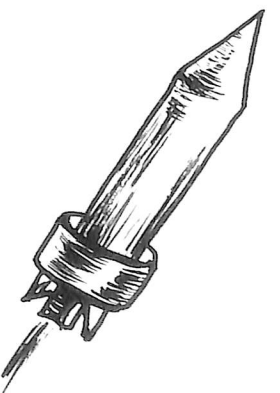
# DEDICATION
