With this in mind, we have tried to put into words and pictures some of the beauty of this wonderful year, that the memory may bring us joy forever.



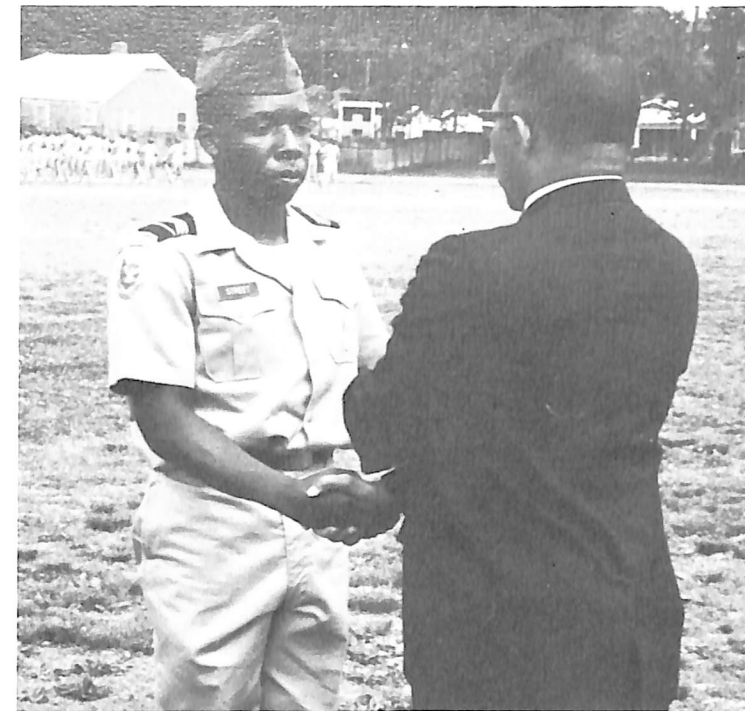

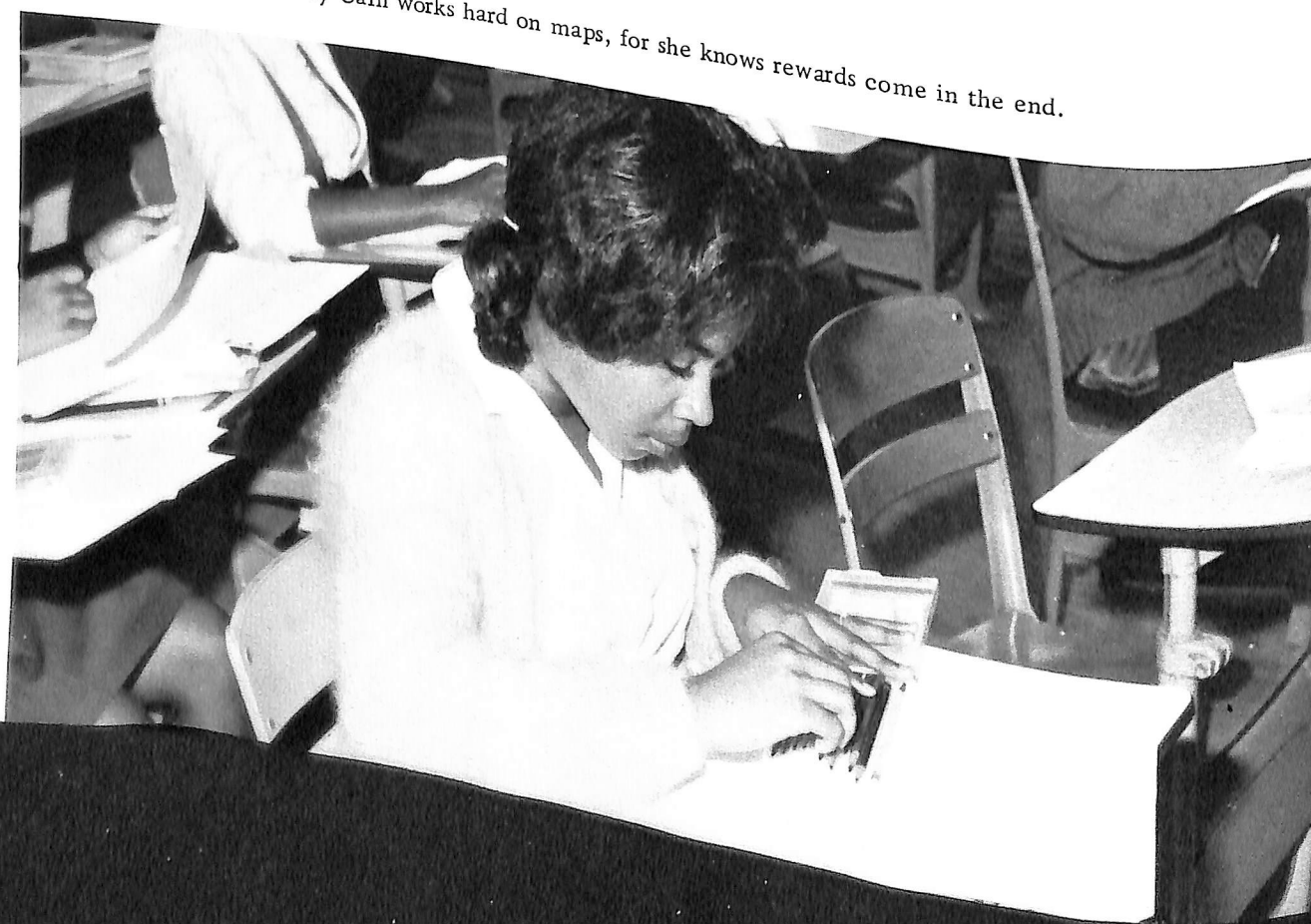

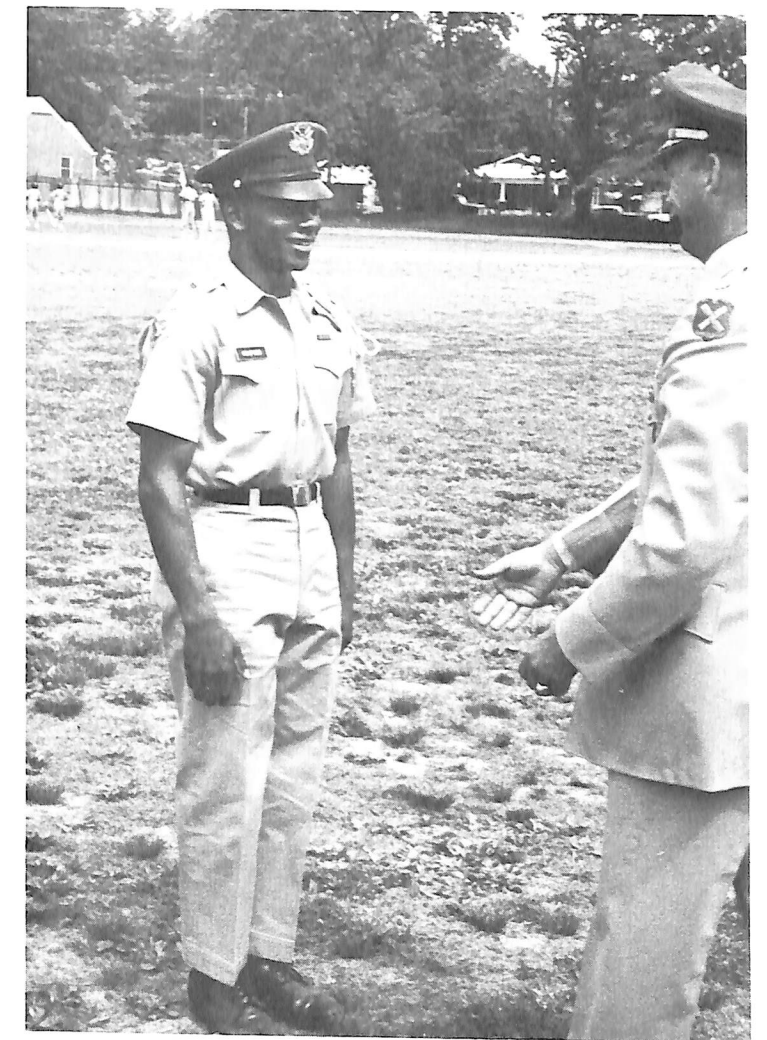

School Spirit Inspires . . .

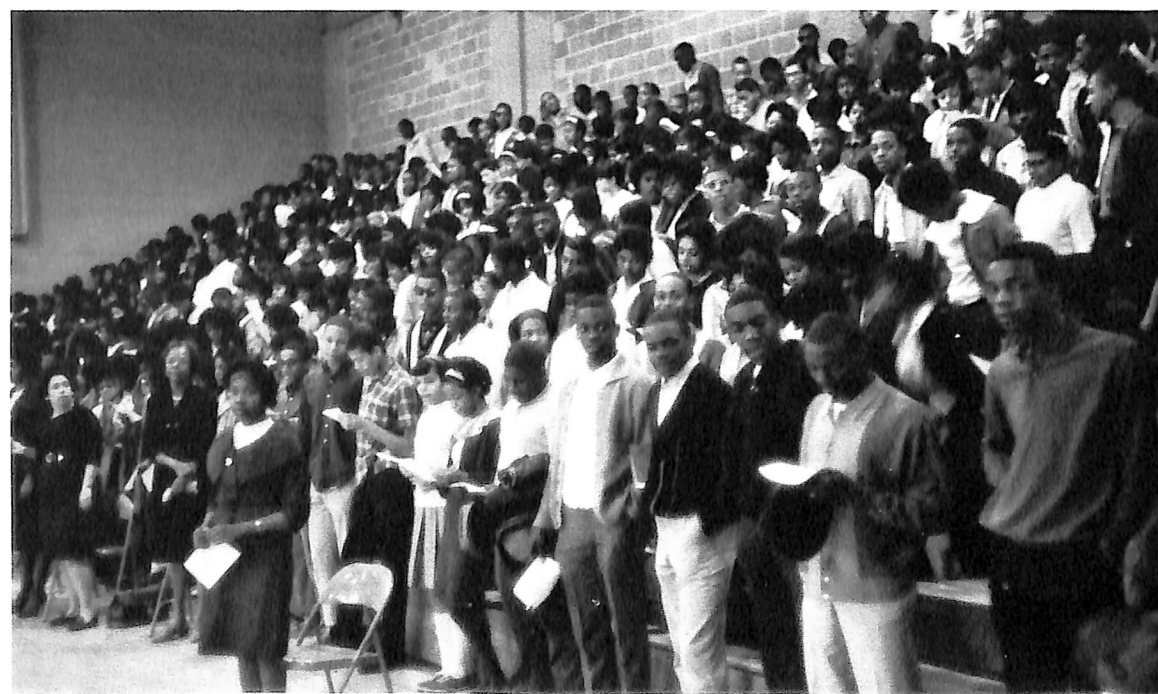

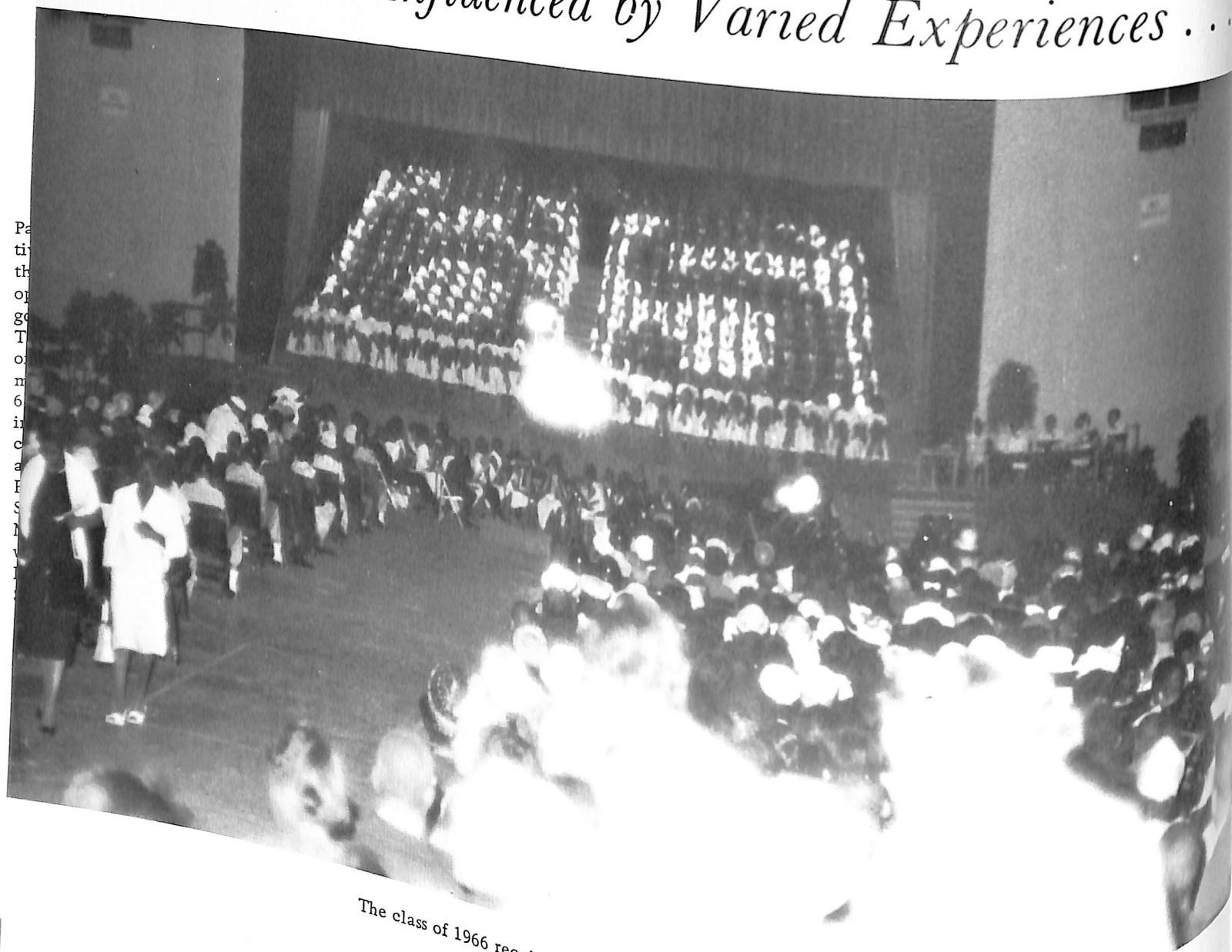


Creativity is an important factor in our marching band. The students here, exhibit their talents as they play and swing to the rhythm of "Watermelon Man".

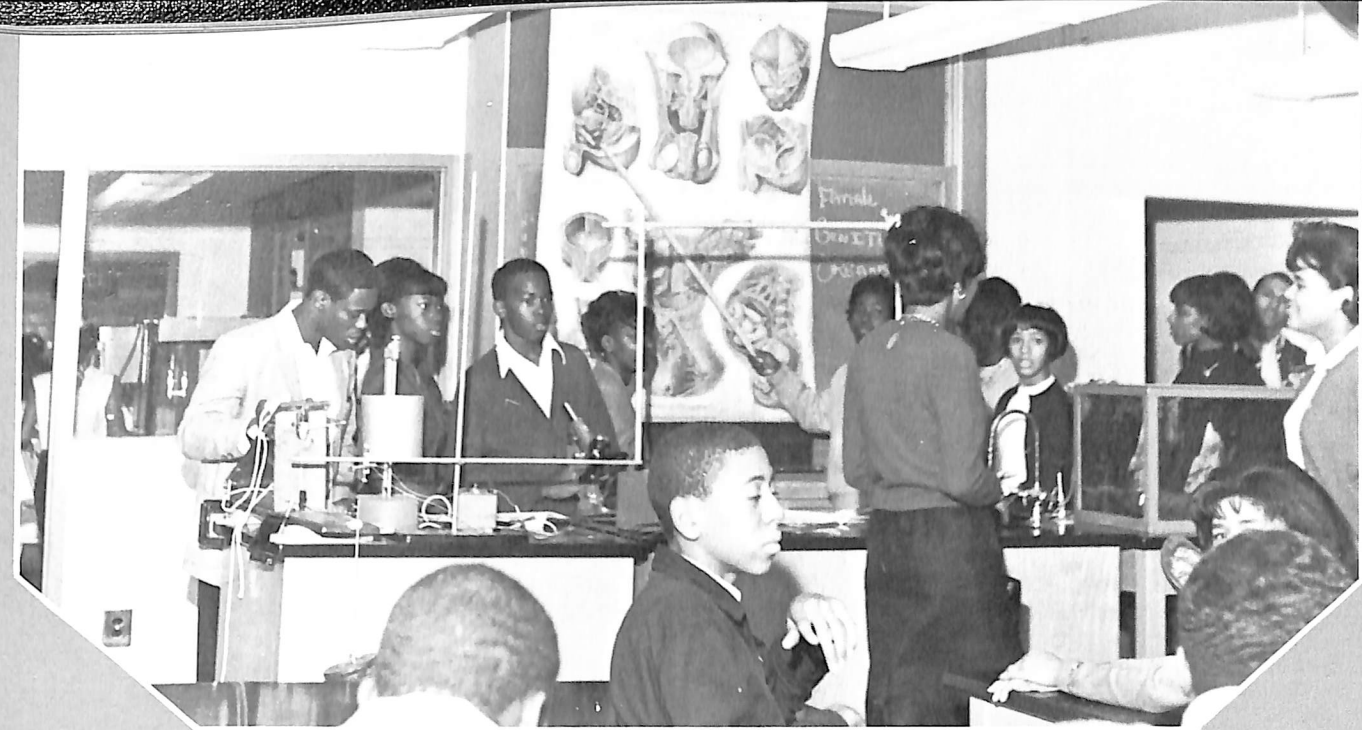
