
THE HISTORY OF

BOOKER T. WASHINGTON MIGH SCHOOL

BOOKER T. WASHINGTON COMPREHENSIVE HIGH SCHOOL OPENED IN 1924 UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE ATLANTA BOARD OF EDUCATION, WITH THE LATE CHARLES LINCOLN MARPER AS PRINCIPAL. AS THE FIRST PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL FOR AFRICAN-AMERICANS IN THE STATE OF GEORGIA AND THE ATLANTA PUBLIC SCHOOLS, WASHINGTON MIGH SCHOOL SERVES AS A BEACON IN HISTORY. IN ADDITION TO ITS SIGNIFICANCE TO THE ATLANTA COMMUNITY, THE SCHOOL MAS PRODUCED MANY OUTSTANDING LEADERS INCLUDING DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., CIVIL RIGHTS LEADER; LENA HORNE, SINGER; DR. ASA YANCY, SURGEON; DR. LOUIS A. SULLIVAN, FORMER SECRETARY OF THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MUMAN SERVICES; FILA GAINES YATES, FIRST DIRECTOR OF ATLANTA-FULTON PUBLIC LIBRARY; DR. PEARLIE C. DOVE, EDUCATOR; AND RUBY THOMAS, JUDGE.

WASHINGTON MIGH SCHOOL WAS DESIGNED BY ATLANTA-BORN ARCHITECT EUGENE C. WACHENDORFF. THE BUILDING INCORPORATES MEDIEVAL AND BYZANTINE ELEMENTS, INCLUDING THE DRAMATIC MAIN ENTRANCE WITH FIVE ARCHES IN TWO TIERS. SIX ADDITIONS HAVE BEEN MADE TO THE ORIGINAL, FOUR-STORY BUILDING LOCATED ON 21.4 ACRES OF LAND.

ONE OF THE FOREMOST BLACK EDUCATORS OF THE LATE 19TH AND EARLY 20TH CENTURIES, BOOKER T. WASHINGTON WAS BORN INTO SLAVERY IN 1856 ON A SMALL FARM IN VIRGINIA. HE ESTABLISHED THE TUSKEGEE INSTITUTE IN TUSKEGEE, ALABAMA IN 1881. IT IS THEREFORE FITTING THAT VISITORS PASS A REPLICA OF THE FAMED BOOKER T. WASHINGTON STATUE ENTITLED "LIFTING THE VEIL OF IGNORANCE" ON THE WAY TO THE ENTRANCE. THIS REPLICA WAS ERECTED IN 1927. THE ORIGINAL STATUE, BY SCULPTOR CHARLES KECK, SITS ON THE CAMPUS OF TUSKEGEE UNIVERSITY. THE INSCRIPTION ON IT READS: HE LIFTED THE VEIL OF IGNORANCE FROM HIS PEOPLE AND POINTED THE WAY TO PROGRESS THROUGH EDUCATION.





The defining goals of our partnership have been: (i) to apply our skills as lawyers and legal staff to enhance our students writing skills, (ii) to see all of our students graduate at the end of their senior year prepared to attend college and (iii) to inspire at least \02 of our students to attend law school and at least one of the students to return to practice law at Kilpatrick Stockton UP. As a group, they have accumulated more than \$4.5 million dollars in post-secondary funds
