High School Junior (11th grader) or Senior (12th grader)

3.0 Core GPA 3.2 or higher test optional

2 Units of English, Math, Science and 1 Unit of Social Science

Completion of Algebra II required to enroll in College Algebra

SAT

480 EBRW| 440 Math

PSAT- 480 EBRW | 440 Math (510 Math for College Algebra Placement)

ACT

17 English or Reading | 17 Math

Accuplacer

237 - Reading | 4 - WritePlacer | 258 - Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra & Statistics





Admissions Requirements

Classification

Sophomore (10th grader)

3.0 Core GPA

2 Units of English, Math, Science and 1 Unit of Social Science Completion of Algebra II required to enroll in College Algebra

SAT

1200 Total

ACT

26 Composite

- 10th graders must score a 1200 SAT total or 26 Composite on the ACT for acceptance
- 10th graders are not eligible to submit Accuplacer or PSAT for acceptance



Admissions Deadlines

Semester	Application Deadline	Document Deadline	Classes Begin
Summer 2024	March 29, 2024	April 12, 2024	May 13, 2024
Fall 2024	April 12, 2024	April 26, 2024	August 12, 2024





Dual Enrollment Funding

- Dual Enrollment Funding cap is 30 Semester credit hours
- Funding pays 100% of a student's tuition, student fees, and required book rental
- Funding only covers approved courses
 - Core academic areas (English, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Languages)
 - Career, Technical, and Agricultural (CTAE) Courses
 - Fine Arts, Physical Education, and Health <u>not</u> eligible for Funding
- No funding rewarded for the same course taken twice
- Students are ineligible for DE funding after their
 2nd course withdrawal



Dual Enrollment Funding

What will be your funding responsibility?

- Course lab fees
- Proctored exams for online classes (\$8-30 per test)
- Scantrons
- Non-funded courses & Self-pay courses
 - Responsible for tuition, student fees, and books
- Parking (if you are attending F2F Classes)
- Housing and Meal Plans (optional)

Reminders

- ✓ Meet with your high school counselor to determine your DE classes
- ✓ Submit your funding application before applying to your DE College of Choice
 - ✓ Your funding application is not the same as your DE College admission application
- ✓ A GPA lower than a 2.0 is an automatic dismissal from KSU's DE program
- ✓ Use your campus resources for tutoring if you are falling behind in classes
- ✓ If you are a male turning 18 during your time as a DE student, you must complete selective service
