

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






IB Curriculum

- Curriculum is organized around six themes of global significance
- Units are usually a 6-8 week
 in-depth exploration of a concept
- Students and teachers inquire into a central idea
- Guided by lines of **inquiry** as well as teacher and student questions

Social Emotional Learning



What is SEL?

Social and emotional learning (SEL) involves processes through which children and adults develop fundamental emotional and social competencies to understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions.

Pre-K Programming

- Values that play is the primary driver for inquiry and learning
- Who We Are, How We Organize Ourselves, Sharing the Planet-units that explore relationships, community and the world around them
- 2 traditional classrooms; 1 neurodivergent class
- Application closes on March 12th; lottery drawing on March 27th
- Open to residents within the APS zone
- Child must turn four years old by September 1, 2023
- Results are emailed to the applicants after a verification process



Reading and Writing Workshop

Reader's Workshop

- Mini-Lessons based on the Georgia Standards of Excellence, literary analysis, strategies and skills, and writing about reading.
- Independent reading, partner reading, small group, and one on one conferring with teacher to practice strategies.
- Literacy Stations

Writer's Workshop

- Mini-Lessons designed for explicit instruction on the writing process and evidence-based writing.
- Independent writing allows students time to work while the teacher confers.



Math Workshop

- Developed with the idea that students need to know more than just "what works" when solving a problem
- Develops a deeper understanding to know "why it works"
- Goes beyond formulas and facts
- Develops a conceptual understanding
- · Students become literate and fluent in Math





Dual Language Immersion



- Spanish is taught to all students
- Increased focus on meaningful and purposeful communication rather than grammatical mastery
- Develop cultural awareness
- Acquire proficiency with listening and speaking



Dual Language Immersion (DLI)

- Academic and linguistic development in Spanish and English (Bilingual & Biliterate)
- Develop greater cognitive flexibility
- Better prepared to collaborate and communicate across linguistic and political boundaries



Dual Language Immersion (DLI)

- Class Composition (50% Native English speakers; 50% Native Spanish speakers)
- Limited enrollment 44 spots filled via lottery
- Program of Choice Native English speakers can complete application for DLI in K and 1st grade

- Students in the building after 3:15 pm will report to the front office.










- On-site provided by <u>Preferred School Care</u> <u>www.pscafterschool.com</u>

- Off-site care options: Agape and YMCA





Registration Timeline


- · Pre-K applicants must live within the APS zone
 - Lottery drawing is March 27, 2023; registration details follow after acceptance
- K-5th grade must live within the Bolton Academy zone
 - · Begins on March 13, 2023
 - · Register online
- DLI Application is included Kindergarten registration
 - Deadline to apply is June 1, 2023
 - Lottery drawing will take place within a week with notification by mail/email.

 Once you complete the online registration, you will need to email our front office team the 5-digit application code so we can finalize the registration. There will be instructions on our Bolton Academy website on how to find the code.



Registration Documentation

- Parent's or Guardian's Drivers License or Acceptable ID
- · Certified Copy of Birth Certificate (original required for K)
- · Social Security Card (original required for K)
- Proof of Residency Documentation
 - Lease, deed or mortgage statement with your name and address
 - Georgia Power bill within 30 days in your name and address
 - If lease or deed is not in your name, you will need to provide 3 supporting documents with your name and address.
- Declaration of Residency- download from Registration website
- · Certificate of Immunization (must be current-GA Form 3231)
- Certificate of Vision, Hearing, Dental and Nutrition Screening (must be current- GA Form 3200)
- Withdraw Paper from previous school (if applicable)
