- ▶ Title I began in 1965 the Elementary and Secondary Act (ESEA) as a federal program to ensure equal opportunities for low income school districts.
- ▶ Through Title I, the federal government disburses money to school districts based on the number of low-income families in each district as determined by census data.
- ▶ The school uses its Title I money to supplement and improve educational programs offered to help ALL students meet state standards.
- ▶ In December 2015 ESEA was renamed ESSA-Every Student Succeeds Act

WHAT IS TITLE 13

► The Purpose of Title I...is to ensure that ALL students have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging State academic achievement standards and State academic assessments.

- Students do better in school and feel better about themselves
- Teachers understand the needs and concerns of students and parents
- ▶ Parents understand their child and be more involved in their child's education
