What is Title I ?



- It's the largest federal aid program for public schools in the United States.
- Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improving teaching and learning for students.
- Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parent and family engagement.

CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT PLAN GOALS

Booker T. Washington High School's goals for SY23-24 are to improve student achievement by focusing on the following goals:

- ▶ **Goal 1 – Each content will decrease the number of beginner learners by 8% and increase the number of proficient and distinguished learners by 5%.**
- ▶ **Goal 2 – Increase Average Daily Attendance by 10%.**
- ▶ **Goal 3 – Decrease CCRPI attendance from 65% to 60%.**

Programs and Supports

Whole Child Intervention Team: reviews student data and determines which students need additional help in areas of academics, attendances, behavior, and mental health.

Positive Behavioral Intervention & Supports: an evidence-based, tiered framework for supporting students' behavioral, academic, social, emotional, and mental health. When implemented with fidelity, PBIS improves social emotional competence, academic success, and school climate.

Community in Schools: surrounds students with a community of supports, empowering them to stay in schools to achieve in life.

Raising Expectations: empowers students in crises by elevating academic, social and civic expectations to facilitate high school graduation and post-secondary plans, including obtaining trade skill certifications.
