Highlights

Atlanta Public Schools (APS) coach educators and debaters accelerated debate during the final few days of October and into November. On October 29th, 8 APS elementary schools showed up for the first elementary tournament since January 2020. Debaters from Continental Colony, Deerwood, Harper-Archer, Hutchinson, Kimberly, Miles, Parkside, and West Manor debated the merits of Georgia public policy to address human-caused global warming. 18 coach educators, parents/guardians, and community members volunteered to serve as debate judges, providing celebratory and constructive feedback to the AUDL's youngest debaters.

The middle school division continued to be a significant instigator for debate in November, with tournaments hosted on November 6th and November 13th. Across both tournaments, **89 student debaters** engaged national public policy on water resource protection. APS's success in the middle school division was once again led by **Sutton Middle School** who fielded the **top-ranked team in the middle school junior varsity division** and the 2nd ranked team in the middle school novice division.

APS increased competition in the high school division in November with the addition of coaches and debaters from **Carver Early College** to the League. On November 13th, they were joined by debaters from **Maynard Jackson High School** and **North Atlanta High School**. APS also led debate in the high school division with **Maynard Jackson High School** fielding the **top-ranked team in the high school novice division**. **North Atlanta High School** also saw significant success and had the **2nd-ranked team in the tournament's most difficult division** (high school OPEN).
