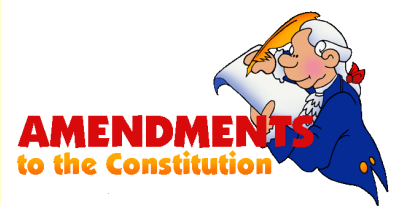

Voting History



An **amendment** is a modification to the Constitution. An **amendment** is ratified when it's signed and made official. **Amendments 15, 19, 24, and 26** all deal with **voting** rights.

Amendment 15 granted African American Men the right to vote.

Amendment 19 granted Women the right to vote.

Amendment 24 granted citizens the right to vote in any primary or other election.

Amendment 26 granted citizens 18 years of age or older the right to vote.

The **Voting Rights Act of 1965**, signed by President Lyndon B. Johnson, prohibits racial discrimination in voting.
