School Goal

Continental Colony's primary focus for the school year is to strengthen our early literacy program.

We will work hard to have 90% of our students performing at developing progress to proficient in ELA and math by Spring 2024.

Second Grade Goals

- By May 2024, students will be able to:

Reading:

- ⇒ apply phonics skills to decode words.
- ⇒ recognize characters, setting, and plot of a story.
- ⇒ find evidence from text to support their writing in a complete sentences.

Math:

- ⇒ add two digit numbers within 100.
- ⇒ subtract numbers fluently using math strategies based on place value.
- ⇒ solve word problems using addition and subtraction.
- ⇒ develop multiplication through skip counting.

- By Spring 2024, more than 66% of our students will leave 2nd grade at/above grade level in reading and math.

We will get there by providing students and parents with literacy and math resources and sight words along with other resources throughout the course of the school year.

In the Classroom

We will reach our goal by supporting students achievement and their families in the content areas:

- ⇒ high-quality curriculum and instruction
- ⇒ ELA reading and comprehend literature and informational texts, including poetry and stories along with writing narrative, informational, and opinion sentences
- ⇒ understanding place value, including addition and subtraction strategies within 100
- ⇒ understanding equal groups of objects to gain foundations for multiplication
- ⇒ communicate regularly with parents/families about student's progress
- ⇒ providing differentiated time for students to meet their educational need
- ⇒ Providing students with the opportunity for tutorial
- ⇒ providing families with content area resources to practice at home

Continental Colony School Students

Continental Colony Elementary School second grade students will:

- ⇒ read 20-30 minutes with a family member.
- ⇒ practice reading and constructing sentences.
- ⇒ practice skip counting using objects, grouping, and measurements.
- ⇒ complete all assignments.
- ⇒ ask for help when I need help.

At Home

Continental Colony Elementary School's parents/families joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading. Families may have other ideas to add to this list.

We will support student learning by helping with:

- ⇒ reading with my child 20-30 minutes a day
- ⇒ applying phonics skills to decode words
- ⇒ practicing reading and constructing sentences
- ⇒ practicing addition and subtraction with grouping within 100 and measurement
- ⇒ attending at least three events (workshop, meeting, Parent-Teacher conference, or Family Night) at the school
- ⇒ assisting with homework
- ⇒ communicating with the teachers regularly
