




GCIS and the BRIDGE Advisement Checklist Activities 11th Grade (Task 17:11-3): State or Local Workforce Development Initiatives



How Do I Complete My BRIDGE Advisement Checklist Activity in GCIS?


1. Log into your student portal provided by your school district.
2. Click on **SLDS Portal** on your dashboard. (The link name may vary depending on your SIS.)
3. Click the **My Career Plan** image. [This button will take you to the Georgia Career Information System (GCIS)].



4. Click **Workforce Development Initiative** to explore the information about state or local workforce development options in the state of Georgia.



5. Click **Complete State or Local Workforce Development Initiative**.
