Intent to Return Declaration Opens February 17 and Closes March 8

As we look forward to the rest of the school year, we will be launching a new Intent to Return declaration period on Wednesday, February 17. With this latest Intent to Return declaration, you are choosing a learning option through the final nine-week quarter. If you don't complete the form by Monday, March 8, your student(s) will remain in their current instructional learning model. The form and details will be available on the <u>Declaration Form page</u> beginning February 17.

Seven-Day Pop-Up Meals Available to Children on Saturdays

In addition to Wednesday meal distribution and curbside meal pickup, our APS Nutrition Department is distributing seven-day pop-up meal kits to children ages 1-18 in the city of Atlanta on Saturdays. Meal kits, which contain 7 breakfasts and 7 lunches, will be available this Saturday, February 13th from 10:30 a.m. to Noon at Hightower Station Shopping Center parking lot at 2636 Martin Luther King Dr. SW. Meal distribution will take place from an APS school bus. All meal kits will be limited to one per child.

COVID-19 Surveillance Testing Enrollment

As we expand our COVID-19 surveillance testing program across the District, I encourage you to sign your child/children up for testing. We just need your signed consent. Students are only required to provide consent once to participate in the weekly surveillance testing. I'm excited to share that as part of our soft launch of the initiative last week, 500 students and staff got tested at Barack and Michelle Obama Academy, Brandon, Burgess Peterson, Cleveland, Humphries, Hutchinson, M. Agnes Jones, and Sarah Smith. Our program continues to expand across the District. Return of Grades 6-12 on February 16 and Adherence to Safety Protocols

We look forward to welcoming our students in Grades 6-12 who opted for in-person learning back to our buildings on Tuesday, February 16! This will complete the second phase of our Return+Learn plan. It is critical that you remind your child/children of the importance of adhering to the District's health and safety guidelines, which include screening measures and temperature assessments upon entry to our buildings, the use of masks and face shields, social distancing, and other hygiene and cleaning procedures. The district has distributed personal protective equipment for our students and employees to use when inside our buildings.
