Expanded Student Supports Begin Next Week

A big "thank you" to our Schools and Academics teams, our school principals and leaders, teachers, and others for working diligently over these past few weeks to ensure we launch our intervention programs for students beginning on Monday.

Many of our students continue to face a myriad of challenges. They have lost invaluable learning time since March, placing them at a greater risk of not being prepared for college, career, and life. Many have experienced the loss of loved ones; others have grappled with racial injustices and police brutality; and others still face food and income insecurity.

Through in-person interventions, we will be working to address students' needs in the areas of academics, wellness, social-emotional learning, and positive behavior supports. I encourage you to learn more by <u>reading my latest blog post</u>.

Sanitizing and Cleaning our Buildings – Legionella Pneumophila Testing

Recently, our Facilities team began proactively conducting random water tests around the District for Legionella pneumophila, the bacteria that causes Legionnaires disease. Water was tested in a sample of our buildings since they have been unoccupied or under-occupied due to COVID-19 for several months and to test the effectiveness of our weekly water flushing program.

Legionella pneumophila can grow in stagnant or standing water or in water systems that are not consistently used. Of the 27 facilities tested, eight (Archer HS/Westside Charter, Brown, Crim/Phoenix Academy, Fickett, F.L. Stanton, Garden Hills, Heritage Academy, and Scott) have at least one water source that came back positive. Out of an abundance of caution and so that our Facilities team can disinfect, and retest water systems, we closed four school buildings today (Brown, Crim/Phoenix, Fickett, and F.L. Stanton) and will await updated test results. The other four school buildings are safe to occupy. Our Facilities team will continue proactive testing of water sources in all schools and buildings throughout the district.

Organizational Changes in Office of Engagement

I want to make you aware that I am shifting the Communications & Public Engagement department from the Office of Engagement to the Chief of Staff's office. Ian Smith, the Executive Director of Communications, will now be a direct report to Jerod Bishop, Chief of Staff. In addition, to align our focus on managing the implementation of our new five-year strategic plan, including renewing our charter system model and strengthening our family and community partnerships, the Office of Engagement will be renamed the Office of Strategy. Dr. Angela King Smith, who leads the division, will have a title change from Chief Engagement Officer to Chief Strategy Officer.

Please continue to contact Dr. Smith and her respective departments for the following types of work: Partnerships and Development (led by Rachel Sprecher), Family Engagement (led by Keasha Copeland), Charter System and School Governance (led by Carolyn Barnett), and Strategy Management and Culture (led by Travis Norvell). Please continue to reach out to your usual contact(s) in the communications department as needed, or request communications services through Ian Smith, Executive Director of Communications & Public Engagement.

Families First Coronavirus Relief Act

The Families First Coronavirus Relief Act (FFCRA) currently provides expanded leave options to individuals who are unable to work for a COVID-related reason. (See APS <u>Administrative</u> <u>Regulation EBB-R3</u> for more details.) The FFCRA is set to expire on December 31, 2020. The District is closely monitoring these potential changes at the federal level that could impact our local telework and leave procedures. Anyone who has been approved for leave or telework prior to December 31 will not be impacted. Staff who have not been approved for telework may be asked to work in person (with extensive safety measures) in December for student interventions or to prepare classrooms/facilities for students. As the District makes decisions about potentially reopening for more students in January 2021, any changes to telework or leave procedures will be shared in a timely manner.
