Subject: Return of Grades 3-12, Self-Reporting Forms Available Online, Consent Forms

Available, GO Teams Declaration Period, and Other Updates

Return of Grades 3-5 on Feb. 8 and 6-12 on Feb 16

Over the next two weeks, we will continue to phase in more students for in-person learning. Grades 3 through 5 will return on Monday, February 8, while grades 6 through 12 will return on Tuesday, February 16. We look forward to welcoming them into our schools!

New Electronic Form for Self-Reporting

We now have electronic forms available for students self-reporting positive COVID-19 cases and exposures. These electronic forms will help Health Services and Human Resources initiate and respond quickly.

Parents/guardians should use the student form to notify their school as soon as possible if their student receives a positive COVID-19 test or if they have been a close contact of someone who has tested positive. The form should be completed for any student who has spent time on campus (whether attending in-person classes or participating in intervention or extracurricular activities). Comprehensive COVID-19 Testing Strategy

We launched COVID-19 surveillance testing this week – just one part of our comprehensive COVID-19 testing strategy -- at Barack and Michelle Obama Academy, Burgess-Peterson, Morris Brandon, Cleveland Avenue, Humphries, Hutchinson, M. Agnes Jones, and Sarah Smith. We will continue to expand across the District, making this testing available to all students. Although testing is not required for students, I strongly encourage everyone to get tested! Your school will communicate with you once testing is available and will provide student consent forms and the notice of privacy.
