Virtual Instruction Quarter 2

• Earlier this month, our superintendent, Dr. Lisa Herring, announced that Atlanta Public Schools will delay its return to face-to-face instruction due to an unfavorable trend in COVID-19 cases in our community and in consultation with public health officials and healthcare experts. That means the district will postpone all reopening plans for in-person learning until January 2021.

Synchronous Learning Monday - Friday

General Expectations

- Will occur via Zoom (K-5)/SeeSaw (PreK only)
- 2. Camera on, if possible, at parent comfort level (communicate to teacher specific concerns)
- 3. Mute your microphone upon entry

Instructional Practices

- 1. Direct Instruction
- 2. Guided Practice
- 3. Explanation of independent learning

Independent Practice

General Expectations

- 1. Camera/microphone off
- 2. Turn on camera/microphone to ask a question or if you have been assigned to a small group
- 3. Set a timer or set a time to return to whole group on time

Instructional Practices

- Teachers will provide/set expectation for what should be completed during this time (graded assignments, page numbers, website/programs, etc.)
- 2. Teachers will model how students access the different options

Asynchronous Learning (Not During School Day)

General Expectations

- 1. Housed in Google Classroom
- 2. All PreK materials will be uploaded/housed in SeeSaw
- 3. Assignment expectations posted in Google Classroom (daily work, independent work, Toddle, etc.)
- Presentations that represent live instruction (Recorded Lessons, PowerPoints, Google Slides, Interactive Digital Resources, Nearpod, or instructional videos).

Asynchronous Options

- 1. Uploaded by 4:00 p.m. daily
- 2. Live instruction videos
- 3. Interactive Digital Resources (Nearpod, iReady, instructional videos, Dreambox, etc.)
- Assignments for completion (complete at your own pace but by posted due dates)

Virtual Learning Reminders

- 1. Students may log into the waiting room as early as 8:00 a.m.
- 2. Live SEL instruction starts at 8:10 a.m.
- 3. We do ask that families allow students to turn on cameras, if they are working, for portions of the lesson. If you are uncomfortable with your camera being on, please communicate to your teacher so you can come up with a plan that works for your family.
- 4. If your camera/microphone is on, please be mindful of the following:
 - 1. Background noise (i.e. loud music, loud talking, use of profanity/inappropriate comments, or other household noises),
 - 2. Attire on camera (i.e. undergarments exposed, walking around with limited or no clothing/shirts/pants).

Virtual Learning Reminders

- 5. Live instruction is being recorded and uploaded into Google Classroom for those families who choose asynchronous learning or whose students are absent for the day.
- 6. We encourage parents to support their students with their learning, but *please refrain* from giving the students the answers.
- 7. If your student needs a longer break, please communicate with the teacher. If students must leave for extended periods of time, please communicate to teacher. Some students have been leaving for hours and coming back disrupting the learning asking "What are we doing?"

8. This is virtual <u>school</u> and students will receive grades for assignments. Please support your student being engaged in the lesson. Please help with students returning from breaks on time.

Grading Practices

b. Each student should receive a minimum of eight (8) grades per subject each quarter

c. For extended core classes that meet only once per week (e.g. elementary school art, music, physical education and foreign language), students must receive a minimum of one (1) academic grade every two weeks.

Enrichment Updates

- Students will receive grades in enrichment courses.
- Enrichment courses are not optional and are a vital part of the instructional day.
- Additional opportunities to demonstrate mastery
 - 4 assignments for each course will be uploaded into Google CR.
 - These assignments will help students improve their grades.
 - Student participation is still encouraged during live instruction.
- Parent contact for students who haven't participated for a consistent period of time.

What Tests will my child take?



- Assessing the academic readiness of students will be critical as we mitigate unfinished learning from last year
- K-2 students may take district benchmarks in ELA & Math only.
- All students in grades 3-5 will take district benchmarks in ELA, Math, Science, & Social Studies
- Students will take an iReady diagnostic in math and reading
- English as a Secondary Language (ESOL) Students may take the ACCESS assessment (PENDING)
- Kindergarten students will be assessed via the GKIDS Inventory
- Georgia Milestones Assessments for 3-5 students
