

Dorm Monitor Housing Program

The Dorm Monitor Program is a leadership program that provides shelter for a single adult male and female for up to 9 months. This program is a night shelter program only. Consumers must leave Monday – Saturday morning by 8:00 AM. Consumers must be able to care for themselves and be willing to provide leadership and direction to consumers in the dorms. Consumers will receive a bed, locker, & 2 meals per day (breakfast and dinner).

- COST:** \$8.00 per night (Including After Care Dorm Monitor)
ELIGIBILITY: 2 forms of identification, no previous balance, and must be eligible for re-admittance; cannot be a sex offender.
HOW TO ENTER: Initial entry into another in house program necessary for referral. Referrals from in-house staff members required.
BED COUNT: Men – 1, Women – 1

Emergency Assessment Housing Program

The Emergency Assessment Housing Program offers shelter for adult male, female, and transgender consumers for up to 30 days once per calendar year. This program is a night shelter program only. All consumers must leave Monday–Saturday morning by 8:00 AM. Consumers must be able to care for themselves. Consumers will receive a bed, locker, & 2 meals per day (breakfast and dinner).

- COST:** Free
ELIGIBILITY: No previous balance, and must be eligible for re-admittance; cannot be a sex offender
HOW TO ENTER: Appointment only. Call or walk in to schedule an appointment on weekday mornings at 8:00 AM. Appointments are made with the receptionist. Walk-ins are accepted on weekends at 10:00 AM.
BED COUNT: Men – 18, Women – 13

Re-Entry Partnership Housing Program

Department of Community Supervision (DCS) Mission: As an integral part of the criminal justice system, we protect and serve all Georgia citizens through effective and efficient offender supervision in our communities, while providing opportunities for successful outcomes.

The Re-Entry Partnership Housing Program is a 90-day residential program for returning citizens recently released on parole or probation by DCS. Each consumer is randomly tested for drug and alcohol use. All consumers in this program are required to follow facility policies and procedures and must report to the program coordinator on a weekly basis. Consumers will receive a bed, locker, & 3 meals per day.

- COST:** There is no cost to the consumer to participate in this program.
- ELIGIBILITY:** **BY REFERRAL ONLY.** Consumer must be referred by Erin Anderson, Tammy Herring, or another employee of DCS.
- HOW TO ENTER:** Your Prison Counselor or Community Supervision Officer should coordinate your arrangements through Tammy Herring, RPH Housing Coordinator, Governor's Office of Transition, Support, and Reentry (GOTSR). Phone: 706-466-4776, Tammy.Herring@dcs.ga.gov
- BED COUNT:** Men-8

Supportive Emergency Housing Program

The Supportive Emergency Program provides shelter for single adult male, female, and transgender consumers for up to 180 days. This program is a night shelter program only; all consumers must leave Monday-Saturday morning by 8:00 AM. Consumers must be able to care for themselves. Consumers will receive a bed, locker, & 2 meals per day (breakfast and dinner).

- COST:** Fee based, 30% of income up to \$10.00 per day
- ELIGIBILITY:** 2 forms of identification, no previous balance, and must be eligible for re-admittance; cannot be a sex offender
- HOW TO ENTER:** Appointment only. Call or walk in to schedule appointment starting weekday mornings at 8:00 AM. Appointments are made with receptionist. Walk-ins are accepted daily except on holidays – 1:00 PM.
- BED COUNT:** Men – 34, Women – 24

City of Atlanta Program

The Fulton County program provides shelter for single adult male and female consumers for up to 90 days. This program is for consumers that became homeless in Fulton County. This program is a night shelter program only; all consumers must leave the building Monday-Saturday morning by 8:00 AM. Consumers must be able to care for themselves. Consumers receive a bed, locker, & 2 meals per day (breakfast and dinner).

COST: There is no cost to the consumer to participate in this program.
ELIGIBILITY: Must be eligible for re-admittance; cannot be a sex offender
HOW TO ENTER: Referral and Appointment only. Appointments are made with receptionist starting at 8:00 AM.
BED COUNT: Women – 5

DeKalb Re-Entry Housing Program

The Dekalb Re-Entry Partnership Housing Program is a 90-day residential program for returning citizens recently released on parole or probation by DCS. Each consumer in this program is randomly tested for drug and alcohol use. All consumers in this program are required to follow facility policies and procedures and must report to the program coordinator on a weekly basis. Consumers will receive a bed, locker, & 3 meals per day.

COST: There is no cost to the consumer to participate in this program.
ELIGIBILITY: *BY REFERRAL ONLY.*
BED COUNT: Men-2

DeKalb County Program

The DeKalb County program provides shelter for single adult male and female consumers for up to 90 days for individuals that became homeless in Dekalb County. This program is a night shelter program only; all consumers must leave the building Monday-Saturday morning by 8:00 AM. Consumers must be able to care for themselves. Consumers receive a bed, locker, & 2 meals per day (breakfast and dinner).

COST: There is no cost to the consumer to participate in this program.
ELIGIBILITY: Must be eligible for re-admittance; cannot be a sex offender

HOW TO ENTER: Referral and Appointment only. Call or walk-in to schedule appointment starting weekday mornings at 8:00AM. Appointments are made with receptionist.
BED COUNT: Men – 1, Women – 3

The Family Programs

Family Emergency Assessment Program

The Family Emergency Housing Program offers shelter for parents and guardians with children up to 60 days, once per calendar year. This program is a night shelter program only. All consumers must leave each weekday morning at 8:00 AM and each weekend day at 10:00 AM. Consumers receive a private room. All rooms are furnished. All family rooms have private bathrooms. Each family member will receive two meals per day (breakfast and dinner).

COST: Free
ELIGIBILITY: Must be eligible for re-admittance; cannot be a sex offender
HOW TO ENTER: Appointment only. Appointments are made with Family Program staff by calling 404.486.2718. The regular office hours are 8:00 AM – 4:00 PM. Calls are taken until 5:00 PM.
ROOM COUNT: 2
TOTAL BEDS: 8

DeKalb Family Emergency Housing Program

The DeKalb Program provides shelter for families for up to 90 days. This is a night shelter program only; all consumers must leave the building, each weekday morning by 8:00 AM and each weekend day by 10:00 AM. Consumers receive a private room and weekly Case Management. All rooms are furnished. All family rooms have private bathrooms. Additional services include, 2 meals per day (breakfast and dinner), financial literacy, referrals, and mental health.

COST: Free
ELIGIBILITY: DeKalb Coordinated Assessment
HOW TO ENTER: Referral/Appointment only. The regular office hours are 8:00 AM – 4:00 PM.
ROOM COUNT: 4
TOTAL BEDS: 16 - 18

City of Atlanta Family Program

The COA Program provides shelter for families for up to 90 days. This is a night shelter program only; all consumers must leave the building, each weekday morning by 8:00am and each weekend day by 10:00 am. Consumers receive a private room and weekly Case Management. All rooms are furnished. All family room have private bathrooms. Additional services include, 2 meals per day (breakfast and dinner), referrals, financial literacy, and mental health.

COST: Free
ELIGIBILITY: City of Atlanta Coordinated Entry
HOW TO ENTER: Referral/Appointment only. The regular office hours are 8:00 AM – 4:00 PM.
ROOM COUNT: 5
TOTAL BEDS: 20

Family Transitional Housing Program

The Family Transitional Housing Program is a fee-based program at \$10 per day. It provides shelter and intensive case management for parents and guardians with children up to one year. This program is a night shelter program only. All consumers must leave each weekday morning at 8:00 AM and each weekend day at 10:00 AM. Consumers are responsible for self-care. Consumers receive a private room. All rooms are furnished. All family rooms have private bathrooms. Each family member will receive two meals per day (breakfast and dinner).

HOW TO ENTER: Appointments only. Must call and schedule appointment with Family Program staff at 404 486-2718 after 4:00 PM.
ROOM COUNT: 11
TOTAL BEDS: 44/48

Assisting these families to overcome these barriers breaks the cycle of crisis and vulnerability and leads them to a path of increased stability and self-sufficiency.

COST: N/A
ELIGIBILITY: Willing participants; families must have children
HOW TO ENTER: In-House referrals, Home Again referrals

Financial Emergency Solutions

Financial Emergency Assistance is available for Fulton County residents who are in need of assistance with utility bills or rent or mortgage payments that are in arrears. Consumers will need a disconnect notice, eviction notice, or warrant to show proof of need in addition to other documentation required for program. All FES consumers also qualify for food assistance.

COST: May require personal matching funds
ELIGIBILITY: Fulton County residents with sustainable income
HOW TO ENTER: By appointment only; appointments are scheduled each Friday

Food Pantry; a Community Food Distribution Program

The Food Pantry is a program that provides nutritious non-perishable items to those persons who are experiencing a shortage of food, to meet the needs of their household. It operates Monday-Friday, 9 AM-2 PM (not open on holidays) and serves the 13 Metro Atlanta counties. Anyone can receive food from the pantry once every 30 days.

The amount of food will be determined by the number of persons in the household.

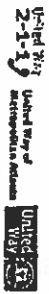
