Increasing Literary Skills

<u>As a teacher</u> - I will provide on grade-level reading materials which will enhance vocabulary skills through reading. I will provide a learning environment that is conducive to student learning success by implementing literature circles, book studies, student-led book talks and provide more "read-talk-write" opportunities.

<u>As a parent</u> - I will continue to provide my child with various reading materials or an environment that is conducive to reading, studying and keeping my child focused. For example, the library, a bookstore and a quiet study area at home.

<u>As a student</u> - I will study more and take more notes to increase my note-taking and study skills. I will also utilize the resources available to help with studying such as having a peer tutor and participating in a math study group.

Building Better Writers

<u>As a teacher</u> - I will provide more writing labs, one-on-one writing revisions and facilitate student-writing mentors as well as increased literary analysis for writing through text dependency. I will also facilitate meaningful learning that is aligned with the language arts curriculum.

<u>As a parent</u> - I will encourage my child to write more often by sharing an experience they've had at school, in their community or in the classroom with their teachers.

<u>As a student</u> - I will write more essays, poetry analysis and use the various different writing styles in my writing more often. I will educate myself on current events, learn about interesting topics and authors and write about something that I am passionate about.
