Extended learning and enrichment opportunities available each week. Offer a parental educational series to address the specific needs of the elementary school scholar. <p style="text-align: center;">School Hours Monday – Friday 7:45 AM – 2:45 PM</p>	<p>Harper-Archer Elementary School parents/caretakers have been invited to develop ideas about how families can support scholars' success in all content areas by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Attending Curriculum Nights, Parent-Teacher Conferences four times a year, monthly Principal Talks, and attend Parent/Caretaker Educational Workshops in the Parent Center with flexible time slots for parental attendance. Check the Parent Portal and My Backpack as a family on a daily to weekly basis. Visit the main office, classroom, check in with room parent(s), check school marquee, check social media, check school websites, and sign up for Class Dojo and Remind to ensure awareness of all activities at the school. Connect scholars and families to service-learning projects in the community. Read at home on a daily basis. Practice math and reading applications on fun learning apps on cell phones, tablets, laptops, and desktop computers. Make flash cards for EVERY subject as a portable and low-tech way to study on the go.

<p>Harper-Archer Elementary School scholars joined with staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach personal goals in all content areas. Our scholars thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complete my classwork/homework every day and check My Backpack daily. Talk with my family about new vocabulary words, science, math and my progress in each class on a daily basis. Bring home notices from the school (e.g. daily agendas, flyers and progress/report cards). Participate in reading programs throughout the year (e.g. Pizza Hut BOOK IT! and Six Flags Read to Succeed Program). Invite my parents to volunteer in my classroom and at school. Practice math, science and reading on fun learning apps on cell phones, tablets and computers daily.
