## STEM@HOPE-HILL

Our students in Prek-2nd grade observed caterpillars form chrysalises and turn into butterflies. It was fun to watch our students release their pollinators outside the school. In addition to our younger grades watching the life cycle of butterflies, some classes also watched the life cycles of lady bugs and then started an ant farm. Our eagles are having a great time learning more about insects!


We were fortunate to have two of our very own HopeHill parents come and teach our fifth graders about microorganisms. Our students had to analyze
their class data to determine which food had the harmful microorganism. Not only did our 5th graders get to learn about microorganisms, but they also learned about different careers in microbiology. The students enjoyed being able to ask our two parents all about beneficial and harmful microorganisms.


As we close the month of April, we are getting prepared for a busy May. Our STEM Ambassadors will attend the 04W5K to support the runners and pass out water. A time for catching fireflies, trips to the pool and firing up the grill, and the list goes on and on. Let's face it, while a lot of people know that math is fun, it can often be a bit of a struggle to convince children to think so too! One great option to support your child this summer that is engaging and fun to do with the whole family is BOARD GAMES! I want to encourage every family to play board games at least once a week. Look at the five board games below that reinforce math skills:
CandyLand- Matching, counting, following directions, and identifying patterns are all included in playing Candy Land.

Monopoly- Monopoly is filled with math lessons. It can teach kids how to add, subtract, and even multiply through using fake money to buy imaginary properties.

PayDay- Payday is a classic game that is perfect for working on addition, subtraction, and money concepts.

Yahtzee- Strategy and addition are key when playing Yahtzee. Mental math at its best!

Chutes and Ladders- This game is jam-packed with math skills. Students will count forwards or backwards, one to one correspondence and identifying numbers up to 100 .

Life- A fun game of life events and how to budget accordingly for your family.

One last thing, please continue to work on these math skills:

Pre-K- Count to 100
Kinder- Count to 120; fluently add and subtract within 10

First- Count dimes and pennies; add and subtract within 20

Second- Add and subtract fluently within 20; know how to regroup when adding and subtracting whole numbers within 100; tell time

Third- Get those multiplication facts and division facts memorized; add and subtract within 1,000

Fourth- Add/subtract within 1,000,000; get those multiplication facts and division facts memorized.

Fifth- Multiply 3 by 2 digit and 2 digits by 2-digit numbers; get those multiplication facts and division facts memorized.
