

What is GHP?

- A four-week residential program designed to provide intellectually gifted and artistically talented high school students challenging and enriching educational opportunities not usually available during the regular school year.
- High school sophomores and juniors in public, private, and home schools are eligible for nomination in one of 20 areas.
- Because the program is exceptionally unique and prestigious, a student must partake in an intense series of applications and interviews to earn admission to GHP


The Process



Why GHP?

- The Governor's Honors Program (GHP) presents lifechanging social and academic opportunities for students.
- Activities provide each participant with opportunities to acquire the skills, knowledge, and attitudes to become independent, life-long learners.
- This program also provides students with great networking opportunities that extend beyond their participation in the program.

District Component

- Kickoff: District content coordinators present criteria for student nominations
- Nominations: District-wide content area teachers nominate students for participation
- ✓ Online Application: District portal to qualify for district interview
- ✓ Interviews: District-wide personnel conduct local level student interviews
- Prep for Success Session: Content area leaders provide support to students on articulating their responses and providing "dress for success" tips for state-level interviews
- ✓ **APS Finalists:** GOSA announces state-level finalists
