





How can parents help to develop students who are knowledgeable at home?

- Encourage your child to be aware of current events by watching the news or reading articles.
- Explore connections between topics.
- When your child asks a question, encourage them to find the answer, rather than giving them the answer.
- Ask your child about what they are learning in school and engage them in conversation about it.
- Foster areas of interest that your child displays through books, outings, and activities.

Ask:

- “Why do you think this is important to know?”
- “Can you think of anything that’s happening today that might be similar to?”
- “What does that make you think of?”
- “Does that remind you of anything else you’ve learned?”
