Principal's Message

Panther Family,

I want to extend my gratitude for your support during Homecoming Season. Homecoming 2024 was so enjoyable for the scholars, staff, and our Carver community. We thank you for your participation.



As we prepare to return to our regularly scheduled activities, please note that we are nearing the end of Quarter One. Grades will be posted during the week of October 7th. Early College scholars are expected to demonstrate mastery in <u>all</u> their courses. Failure is not an option at EC. If your scholar is not meeting the expectation, they are required to attend tutorials.

Also, we return to our uniform expectations this week. Scholars must be in EC attire. I am aware that the weather is changing; however, scholars are only permitted to wear outerwear including hoodies, jackets and sweaters that display the Early College logo or in solid school colors (maroon, white, gray, and black). If scholars need uniform support, they may meet with the school social worker.

Dually enrolled scholars must always display their lanyards around their necks. While they are allowed to wear relaxed dress code according to APS policy; dual enrollment scholars are not allowed to wear clothing with rips and holes. Parents, I respectfully request your partnership in holding our scholars to these expectations.

Finally, at Early College, we require scholars to have a 90% CCRPI attendance rate. Currently, we only have 68.3% of the scholars meeting this expectation. We need your help in making sure your scholars are here each week on time. Regular school attendance drives academic success. This week we will host our Attendance Allstar Celebration for the scholars who are meeting the goal.

As always, remind our scholars that they are the best and the brightest, and they attend the First and the Finest early college of ALL the Early Colleges in the state of Georgia. We are Creative, Compassionate and Courageous. We are Carver Early College! Make it a momentous week.






STEM Happenings



Physics Class Mousetrap Race Car Challenge






Race2Read


