 Accelerated Career will improve APS' graduation rate and ensures students graduate with credentials aligned to in-demand Metro-Atlanta careers.







Accelerated Career pathways offer qualified students a unique path to high school graduation. Students choose to simultaneously earn a high school diploma and a college Associate Degree, Technical Diploma, or two (2) Technical Certificates of Credit (TCC's) in a specific career pathway. Some of the required high school courses may be taken under the state-funded Dual Enrollment program.

Complete all nine High School Courses

2 English (one must be American Lit & EOC) 2 Math (one must be Algebra 1 & EOC)

2 Sciences (one must be Biology & EOC) 1 Health/Fitness

2 Social Studies (American Government; Personal Finance & Economics; World History or US History)



Complete any of the following Technical College Credentials

Any one Applied Associates Degree or

Any one Technical Diploma Program or

2 Technical Certificates of Credit (TCC's) from the approved list

DUAL FUNDING ENROLLMENT MODELS

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Dual Enrollment is a program designed for approved public, private, and home high schools to allow students the opportunity to take college level courses, while also receiving high school credit.

- 10th grade students can begin dual enrollment CTAE courses at a TCSG institution
- 10th grade students with the appropriate SAT or ACT scores are eligible for dual enrollment core academic courses
- 11th & 12th grade students are eligible for all approved dual enrollment courses
- Total cap of 30 Hours / 45 Credits per student prior to graduation
- · Dual Enrollment funding includes funding for tuition, mandatory fees, and books
- · Pending the program of study, there may be some additional fees NOT covered

HOPE GRANT

The Hope Grant is available to Georgia residents who are working towards a certificate or diploma at an eligible college or university in Georgia. The HOPE and/or Zell Miller programs have Paid-Hours and Combined-Paid hours limits.

Paid-Hours Limit

- 63 semester hours
- All hours paid by HOPE and/or Zell Miller Grant are counted in the Grant Paid-Hours Limit

Combined-Paid Hours Limit

- 127 semester hours
- All hours paid by HOPE and/or Zell Miller Grant or Scholarship are counted in the Combined-Paid Hours Limit.

SENATE BILL 86 (SB 86) EARLY ACCESS TO HOPE GRANT

SB 86 allows a dual enrollment student to access HOPE Grant funds for their CTAE courses prior to exceeding their 30 dual enrollment hours. All HOPE Grant criterias are required.

This program is only available for programs on the HOPE Career Grant list

HOPE CAREER GRANT

The HOPE Career Grant is an extension of the HOPE Grant allowing additional funds for programs on the high demand list. Residency and hour counts are still applicable.

HOPE SCHOLARSHIP

Students do not have access to HOPE Scholarships funds until after high school graduation. Please note that HOPE Grant / HOPE Career Grant hours used will count against the allotted 127 allowed hours.

Students must be in 10 th , 11 th and 12 th grade with a GPA of 2.0 to meet the admissions requirements for Atlanta Technical College	Students must be in the 11 th or 12 th grade with a HOPE GPA of 2.6 to meet the admissions requirements for Atlanta Technical College
