✓ Utilize data from the new district screener (NWEA MAP), CFAs, and unit assessments to drive all instructional decisions inclusive of intervention.


✓ Continue with grade level data meetings within PLCs in order to intentionally plan and execute effective instruction.

- Continued emphasis on evidence/research-based instructional practices.
- Continued focus on effective lesson planning, internalization, and delivery through weeklyextended PLC meetings with the Content Instructional Leaders/Administration
- Increased exposure and opportunities for students to engage in academic competitions and exhibitions.



What will Whole Childle Intervention look like at Douglass?

- ✓ Continued engagement with RTI/MTSS Specialist.
- ✓ Content-specific teachers as credit recovery facilitators
- ✓ Engagement and intervention with Reading/Math Specialists.
- ✓ Engagement with a full-time Behavior Specialist and implementation of restorative practices.
- ✓ Integration of SEL behavior and wellness plans with fidelity led by Behavior Specialist.
- ✓ Cluster-based Student Support Specialist
- ✓ Grant funded Transitional Coach (licensed mental health professional)
- ✓ Ongoing engagement of the Care Team PLC to ensure alignment of services and resources for our students and families.

Implementation of Read/Math 180 as tools for intervention.


Engagement of STE(A)M (project-based learning) and 3DE (case studies) for enrichment.









Student Engagement



Impact of the Pandemic

What We're Facing...

- 145 students are repeating the 9th grade for the 1st time; 70 students are repeating the 10th grade for the 1st time.
- Learning Loss: 360 courses need to be recovered this school year
- Students are struggling to readjust to a structured environment
- Neighborhood conflicts have followed our students to school
- Many upperclassmen are still working during the day and/or long evening shifts

Our Responses...

- Credit recovery model that support all students with one virtual teacher and one FDHS teacher as a tutor.
- Utilizing restorative practices whenever possible to help students better handle possible past trauma experienced in the pandemic and to better readjust.
- Collaborating with APD to understand what our scholars have been experiencing in the neighborhood for the past 15 months.



Quarantine or Isolation: What's the difference?


Quarantining

Quarantine keeps someone who might have been exposed to the virus away from others.

Isolation keeps someone who is infected with the virus away from others, even in their home.

Who Needs to Quarantine After Exposure to a Positive Case?

People who are not vaccinated and have been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19.



What Counts as Close Contact?

You were within 6 feet of someone who has COVID-19 for a total of 15 minutes or more

You provided care at home to someone who is sick with COVID-19

You had direct physical contact with the person (hugged or kissed them)

You shared eating or drinking utensils

They sneezed, coughed, or somehow got respiratory droplets on you

Who Doesn't Need to Quarantine After Exposure?

People who are fully vaccinated and not experiencing any symptoms.

Note: Fully vaccinated people should get tested 3-5 days after their exposure, even if they do not have symptoms

People who have tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 3 months and recovered do not have to quarantine or get tested again as long as they do not develop new symptoms.

Note: Persons exposed to other persons who have been exposed do not need to quarantine.



Who will quarantine?

In the event of an identified positive case of COVID-19, all close contacts (as identified by case investigation in collaboration with health services) must be excluded (recommended for quarantining) from the school until fourteen days after last contact 2 with case (usually last day the case attended).

If a close contact becomes ill and is diagnosed with COVID-19, they must remain excluded for their isolation period and until told they are no longer contagious.

If cohorting was practiced so that the case would have only had contact with those in the same classroom, the other teachers, staff and students in the school do not need to be quarantined.

If classes were not cohorted, the school needs to assess everyone in the school that the case may have come into contact with and exclude them for the 14-day quarantine period.


