


Achieve Atlanta Scholarship Overview 2019-20

Atlanta has one of the country's lowest rates of social mobility, with implications for equitable life outcomes

Absolute upward mobility: mean child rank for parents at 25th percentile




Low social mobility means that children born into families with lower income have little chance of achieving income level of higher quintiles as adults

Postsecondary degree attainment is an important driver of upward social mobility


Unemployment rate and mean weekly earnings by educational attainment¹






A college education **dramatically increases likelihood of employment and income level**; this is true for elite colleges, other 4-year institutions, and community colleges²

Nationally, and in Atlanta, the chances of going to college are very strongly related to household income





% of APS graduates seamlessly enrolling in college (2016 and 2017 cohorts)



This correlation creates a **vicious cycle for social mobility**. Unless the tie between family income and educational attainment is broken, upward social mobility, especially for our poorest families, is likely to remain out of reach

Scholarship Basics: Student Eligibility Criteria

Initial Eligibility (High School Seniors)

Student Eligibility Criteria	
APS Enrollment	At least 2 yrs
Financial Need	EFC = \$0 - \$8,000
Minimum GPA	≥75 for 2-yr path; ≥80 for 4- yr path
Post-secondary Enrollment	Enroll seamlessly and full- time in an accredited, nonprofit institution



Scholarship Basics: Eligible Institutions

Eligible Institutions	
Туре	Accredited, non-profit institutions in-state and out-of-state
Out-of-state	Graduation rate of ≥ 44%
Use of funds	Tuition, room, board, books and fees (full Cost of Attendance)



Scholarship Basics: Awards

- 4-year degrees: \$5,000 renewable for 4 years
- 2-year & Technical degrees: \$1,500
 renewable for 2 years
- Fully funded students: \$1,000 one-time grant



Scholarship Basics: How To Apply

STEP 1: Complete 2020-2021 FAFSA (save Student Aid Report)

STEP 2: Verify eligibility criteria, including EFC, minimum GPA, and APS enrollment

STEP 3: Complete online application at achieveatlanta.org starting January 30, 2020. Applications due May 31, 2019.

Provisional award notice two weeks after submission. Final awards announced June 15th, 2019.

Scholarship Basics: Key Dates

Oct 1st
 FAFSA opens

January 30th Scholarship application opens

May 31st Scholarship application closes*

June 15th Final scholarship awards announced

*Students wishing to be recognized at graduation must apply by April 30th.
