Scholarship Basics: Student Eligibility Criteria

Initial Eligibility (High School Seniors)

| Student Eligibility Criteria | |
|------------------------------------|--|
| APS Enrollment | At least last 2 years of HS |
| Financial Need | EFC = \$0 - \$8,000 |
| Minimum GPA (cumulative, weighted) | 75 |
| Post-secondary Enrollment | Enroll full-time in an eligible college/university by the fall after HS graduation |

Scholarship Basics: Eligible Institutions

| Eligible Institutions | |
|-----------------------|---|
| Type | Accredited Non-profit private or public Technical programs |
| State policy | Most* in the state of GA Outside of GA, need grad rate of ≥ 44% according to College Scorecard |

*Starting with graduating class of 2021 the Scholarship cannot be used at Atlanta Metropolitan State College



Scholarship Basics: Awards

The scholarship award amount depends on if you enroll in a 2-year or 4-year college/university program.

4-year degrees: \$5,000 renewable for 4 years

 2-year & Technical degrees: \$1,500 renewable for 2 years

Fully funded students: \$1,000 one-time grant

Scholarship Basics: How it Works

 Funds pay for tuition, room, board & fees (full cost of attendance)

 Funds go directly to post-secondary college/university

• Scholarships are renewable, subject to additional academic requirements (enrollment, GPA, pace)

Scholarship Basics: How To Apply

- STEP 1: Complete 2021-2022 FAFSA (save Student Aid Report)
- STEP 2: Verify eligibility criteria, including EFC, minimum GPA, and APS enrollment
- STEP 3: Complete online application at achieveatlanta.org starting <u>February 2022</u>. Applications due May 31, 2022.

<u>Provisional</u> award notice two weeks after submission. Final awards announced June 2022.

 FAFSA opens

February Scholarship application opens

May 31st Scholarship application closes*

June
 Final scholarship awards announced

• June-August Students accept scholarship, provide

final college acceptance letter, and

complete survey to assist college supports

*Students wishing to be recognized at graduation must apply by April 30th.
