Role of School Counselors

School counselors provide services in the areas of counseling, consulting, coordinating, and crisis response.

Counseling

- Individual and group counseling
- Group counseling and guidance are preferred delivery methods due to time and resources
- Groups address a myriad of remedial and preventive factors that attribute to high school success (i.e. study skills, time management, substance abuse, conflict resolution, grief & loss)

Consulting

- Consult with parents, other helping professionals, school personnel, community organizations, and, mental health partner on behalf of students.
- Classroom Instruction, most frequent type of consulting performed by school counselors (i.e. SEL).

Role of School Counselors

Coordinating

- School counseling programs encompass a vast amount of services that include coordinating
- Some program and activities coordinated include college fairs, college & career programs, financial aid sessions, PSAT/SAT Prep.


Crisis Response

- Provide support in critical situations (i.e. violence, abuse, suicidal ideation)
- Provide immediate intervention & follow up



Atlanta Public Schools Graduation Requirements

- Satisfy attendance requirements (no more than 6 unexcused absences)
- Successfully complete required high school coursework
- Take the Milestones End of Course (EOC)
 Assessment for EOC subjects
- Complete 75 hours of community service

Dual Enrollment

Overview

Dual Enrollment provide opportunities for Georgia high school students to earn college credit while enrolled in high school.

- Earn dual credit
- Wide range of courses
- Full time or part time attendance
- 10th Grade: CTAE courses at Technical College System of Georgia
- 11th/12th Grade: Approved courses at University System of Georgia institution or Technical College System of Georgia
- Students accepted into the Dual Enrollment program enjoy the same privileges and opportunities as those enrolled as a college freshman.
- Attendance allowed during the fall, spring, and semesters.
- Students seeking to enroll must meet the requirements as set by the eligible institution
 approved by their high school counselor.



Dual Enrollment

Eligible Institutions

- University System of Georgia
- Technical College System of Georgia

Coursework

- Courses may be taken during the school day or beyond the regular school hours.
- Approved courses must be selected from the approved Dual Enrollment Course Directory.
- □Dual Enrollment Funding Cap: 30 semester hours/45 quarter hours.
- Majority tuition, fees, & books are paid by GSFC (there may be some fees not covered).
- Students earn 3 college credits = to 1 high school credit.
- Additional 10 points earned/posted to high school transcript (core courses only) for courses students pass.
