- If no author is given, begin with the title
- List entries alphabetically
- Basic elements: Author. (Copyright date). Title. Publication city: Publisher.
- Separate each element with a period.

- In works NOT a journal, capitalize only the first letter of the first word of a title, and proper nouns
- Double space
- Use hanging indentation (After the first line of each entry, indent all other lines ½ inch.)

Online News Article: Author (Date). Title of article. *Title of Newspaper*. Retrieved from: URL
