### Health and Safety Update

1. **We are expecting most students to return.** We are anticipating ~1,300 students.
2. While we are all working to create a new normalcy, teaching and learning will remain our focus.
3. If you have not done so, you may want to consider a COVID Vaccination for your child. **This is NOT a mandate.** It is important to understand that some mitigation strategies used previously, such as social distancing, will not be possible with the return of our entire student body.
4. **Suggestion:** All students are encouraged to carry hand sanitizer.
5. ***As of the date of this letter, the district has shared that wearing masks for the upcoming school year is mandatory for all students and staff.*** As always, as information become available, I will share more important health and safety updates.

### School Required Immunization

#### School-Required Immunizations

Per Georgia law, all rising 11<sup>th</sup> graders (entering or transferring) must have proof of a meningococcal booster shot (MCV4), unless their first dose was received on or after their 16th birthday. Documentation must be received before the first day of school to attend class. Exceptions showing medical or religious reasons must be submitted to the school on the Georgia Department of Health's official forms.

**Registration Reminder:** As a reminder: ALL NEW and Rising 9<sup>th</sup> graders MUST be enrolled in Benjamin E. Mays High School, regardless of if they have rolled over from Young Middle School. Online enrollment is available at <https://www.atlantapublicschools.us/domain/16318> .

### Dress Code Corner: Adhering to the APS Dress Code Policy

In alignment to the APS Dress Code policy, we are asking that all students dress in a manner consistent with college and career readiness.

The following are not permitted: clothing with low-hanging or split sides, see-through clothing, halter tops, midriffs, fishnet tops, racer-back shirts, V-back shirts, shirts with spaghetti straps or shirts which expose the chest area.

Students are not permitted to wear sleepwear, pajama pants, leggings, activewear, slippers, slides, or house shoes at any time. (UGG sandals and Crocs must have back strap).

Students may wear skirts and shorts at mid-thigh length or longer. Short skirts or shorts may not be worn, even if pants, shorts, or leggings are worn underneath. Students may wear sleeveless shirts, but the straps must be neck to shoulder in width.

Any students not adhering to the dress code will be asked to change into appropriate attire or will be given the option to call a parent for a change of clothing.

**Footwear** – Shoes must be worn; no bedroom shoes or slippers shall be worn.



**Shirts / Tops** – Halter tops, tank tops, backless tops, tops with thin or no straps (4 finger min.), or tops that show the midriff or expose the body are prohibited. No cleavage is permitted to be showing (no low tops). No see through clothing (exception: may layer if undershirt is allowable).



**Shorts/Jeans/Dresses** – Shorts/dresses must be no shorter than 3" above back of knee. Overly tight clothing is not permitted. All bottoms must be worn at the waist.



**Inappropriate Slogans, Etc.** – Clothing/Accessories shall not be worn if they display profanity, violence, lewd/obscene messages, or images. This includes ads that could be offensive.



**Head Coverings, Etc.** – No head coverings are to be worn in the building unless required by a physician or documented religion purposes.





Students are permitted to bring either a **CLEAR** or **SEE-THROUGH MESH BACKPACK**. Backpacks that are not clear or mesh will not be permitted and will be collected at the entrance. Students are permitted a small purse for personal items, however, be advised that bags large enough to hold a textbook or binder are considered book bags.

For student-athletes, we collaborate with your coaches to ensure athletic equipment bags are stored appropriately throughout the day until afterschool

### Accessing Technology Platforms

- Your scholar must utilize his/her district Username and Password to access key district accounts that are essential to extending education. (Note: most students from APS know this already)
  - **Username** = 1<sup>st</sup> initial of **FIRST NAME** + **LAST NAME** (up to 7 letters) + **last 4 of Student ID #**.
  - **Password** = **Lunch ID #** (NOT student ID, which may be different if coming from a charter)
- **myBackpack is THE key portal for the valuable instructional technology resources needed for learning extension.** This requires your scholar to log-in with their district information, as described above. The link to myBackpack is <https://launchpad.classlink.com/atlanta>
  - Once logged-in with district credentials, most programs are Single Sign On (SSO), so they typically will not need to keep entering UN/PW each work session.

Student Grades in Infinite Campus/Google Classroom

Teachers will continue to instruct, assess standards, and record grades in Infinite Campus, weekly. You can see your student's current progress/grade in Infinite Campus at any time. As students and families have specific questions about assignments and grades, please contact your child's teacher.

- Infinite Campus remains our official gradebook.
  - Parents/Guardians, ensure you have Infinite Campus Parent Portal Access (details below)
- You can expect at least 16 grades per semester (or 8 every 9 weeks). These should be evenly distributed over time (about 1 per week) and fairly distributed across grading categories.
- **IMPORTANT:** On a 4x8 schedule, students earn FINAL Grades that post to official transcripts EVERY SEMESTER.
