Benjamin E. Mays High School 2019-20 Teacher of The Year Dr. Chainey Cherry



Dr. Chainey Cherry has been enriching the lives of young people as an Educator, Musician, Author and Researcher in and around Metro Atlanta for eighteen years. This proud Atlanta native has an outspoken propensity for fine arts education and cultural education for all ages. Dr. Cherry has been very successful at building and restructuring orchestra programs in urban schools by fusing classical and contemporary musical elements.

In less than a year, Dr. Cherry transformed a nearly non-existent high school Orchestra program into a fully functional Superior-rated ensemble. The ensemble that began the 2012 school year with only eighteen students in a single class expanded to three classes with more than seventy students by the fall of 2013. The program has continued to flourish under Dr. Cherry's tutelage. In 2014, she hosted the Georgia Music Educators Association (GMEA) Orchestra Large Group Performance Evaluation (LGPE) Site B in District V. Her orchestras have continued to receive Superior ratings at LGPE each year and have been invited to perform at various district level events, such as the Atlanta Public School's Teacher of the Year Banquet and the Atlanta Police Department's Fallen Officers' Memorial Ceremony at Atlanta City Hall. In August of 2018, The Mays High School Orchestra partnered with Orchestra Noir to perform for Isaac Hayes Day at Atlanta City Hall.

Over the years, Dr. Cherry has had the opportunity to lend her musical reach to programs outside of her school. In March of 2018, Dr. Cherry was invited to serve as a sight-reading judge for the GMEA LGPE for District VI (Clayton, Henry, & Fayette Counties). This year, she served as a concert judge for the District III LGPE in Columbus, GA. Additionally, Dr. Cherry was invited to serve as the clinician for the GMEA District VI 6th Grade Honor Orchestra Clinic in April 2019.

In January of 2019, the Mays High School Orchestra program was awarded an Honorable Mention for Outstanding Community Engagement Program from Music for All's Advocacy in Action campaign through Bands & Orchestras' of America. This honor was received for their 2017 fall production entitled "AnARTchy". This production takes the audience on a journey into a future where public education has no arts programs. Dr. Cherry wrote the show to enlighten the masses of the vast ill effects the students and community would encounter if the arts initiatives continue being abolished from public education.

Dr. Cherry received her Bachelor of Music Education degree from Georgia Southern University in 2001; Master's degree in Administration and Supervision in 2005 from the University of West Georgia; and her Specialist in Educational Leadership from Argosy University in 2009. She attained her doctoral degree from Argosy University in 2013 with a dissertation entitled, "*Teachers' Perceptions of Fine Arts Education and How It Enhances Academic Achievement.*"

When she's not inspiring the lives of young scholars, Dr. Cherry enjoys playing the violin, singing, and spending time with her husband of 15 years, Leo, and their two children, 13 year old Tre and 9 year old Katelyn.
