## Crime Stoppers Atlanta

Crime Stoppers Atlanta rallies and empowers citizens to take a stand against crime in their communities. The program provides an avenue for citizens to anonymously report information about criminal activity, or criminals' whereabouts, and incentivizes them with monetary rewards if the information leads to an arrest and indictment.

Information received through Crime Stoppers Atlanta helps law enforcement investigations and can play a major role in the apprehension and conviction of criminals. By working with police, the public becomes an effective force toward making communities safer.

## Mission

To assist metro Atlanta police agencies in solving crimes by providing cash incentives for anonymous information, allowing citizens to directly impact the safety of their communities.

## Crime Stoppers Atlanta Works

Crime Stoppers is a community based program — managed, operated and funded by members of the community members.

### Community Involvement

Criminals live in the communities that Crime Stoppers Atlanta serves

Someone in the community knows who is committing crimes and can help law enforcement by providing information

Anonymity and monetary incentives to get involved. Private donations help break through the barriers that would normally keep citizens from helping law enforcement, such as:

- Fear of reprisal
- An attitude of apathy
- Reluctance to get involved

**A 2009 RAND Corporation study found the total cost per crime could reach well into the millions of dollars.**

## Program Growth

### Metro Area Reach

Since its inception, the program has seen significant growth, year-over-year, in community and law enforcement support as well as in results. With more than 60 metro Atlanta law enforcement agencies participating in the program,

### Initiatives

Fugitive Stoppers - a partnership with the U.S. Marshals' Southeast Regional Fugitive Task Force to identify and capture wanted criminals in metro Atlanta  
Campus Crime Stoppers - a partnership with Atlanta Public Schools to provide a safe outlet for students to report crimes and help address juvenile crime rates, resulting in safer schools

Burglaries Stoppers - a partnership with the Fulton County District Attorney, the

Fulton County Sheriff and the police chief of Fulton County to form the Fulton County Multi-Jurisdictional Burglary Task Force to help capture burglars and address the increasing burglaries Fulton County

**The average reward is \$618 - \$1,600. A little can go a long way.**

In March 2010, Ali Nejad, aka "Panyhose Rapist," who had been free on a bond awaiting retrial for his 2005 conviction for sexually assaulting two women at gunpoint in midtown Atlanta, removed his ankle monitor and fled upon hearing his bond had been revoked. The Fulton County Sheriff's Office initiated a manhunt and, through a partnership with Crime Stoppers Atlanta, sought information from the public. Within two days of making the case public, Crime Stoppers Atlanta received a tip that Nejad had fled to Texas. Utilizing Crime Stoppers' new Fugitives Stoppers initiative, Nejad was quickly placed behind bars.

## Crime Stoppers Atlanta Success Stories

In August 2009, Kirkwood resident Kenneth Hagen was robbed and shot while mowing his lawn. The Kirkwood Neighbor's Association worked with police, encouraged residents to share any information via Crime Stoppers Atlanta and donated \$730 to the reward pool — making the overall reward \$2,730. Their efforts paid off with an anonymous Crime Stoppers tip. Terrence Hambrick was arrested on charges including aggravated battery, aggravated assault, attempted armed robbery and theft.
