Now, more than ever, it is important to keep the lines of communication open between all district stakeholders. With that in mind, Atlanta Public Schools has adopted **Remind** as the School-to-Home-to-School communication app.

Remind is a free, safe and simple way for your child's school to keep you updated about district, school, and classroom events. Remind also allows two-way communication so you know that your messages are reaching your child's teacher.

Remind works on any device —a computer, tablet or any mobile phone. Remind translates messages into more than 85 languages. You can choose to receive Remind messages through text, email, and the app.

All Atlanta Public Schools students and staff can access their favorite websites and school applications from any device anywhere there is internet connection. You can also download the "APS myBackpack" app in iTunes and Google Play.

Once logged in, myBackpack acts as a single sign-on so you do not have to remember all the different web addresses and passwords for your favorite school resources!

You can access your APS myBackpack from the web (mybackpack.apsk12.org) or download the app from the Apple App Store or Google Play for your tablets and cell phones..

To obtain your myBackpack username and password please contact your student's school.



Your child can access APS myBackpack from any device with WiFi. APS myBackpack can be accessed from the web via http://mybackpack.apsk12.org/ or download in Apple App Store and Google Play.

All Pre-K students will have access to Seesaw. Students will be able to access Seesaw through myBackpack.

Seesaw is a simple way for teachers and students to record and share what's happening in the classroom. Seesaw gives students a place to document their learning, be creative and learn how to use technology. Each student gets their own journal and will add things to it, like photos, videos, drawings, or notes.

Your child's teacher(s) will be using Nearpod this year. Nearpod is an online engagement tool that gives every student a chance to show what they know. Your child can **easily join a Nearpod lesson by using a join code their teacher has provide.** Students can use Nearpod to follow a live lesson with their teacher or complete an independent student paced lesson.

Students can access Nearpod via myBackpack or by going to <u>Nearpod.com</u>. Nearpod is designed to work on any device: iPad, Chromebook, or laptop.



Instead of passively watching a video or observing the teacher on the computer screen, Nearpod allows teachers to add real-time checks for understanding that have built-in accessibility features, like audio responses and Microsoft Immersive Reader.









The Office of Early Learning has adopted Imagine Learning as the Content Management System of the APS Pre-Kindergarten program. Imagine Learning offers Imagine Learning Literacy and Imagine Learning Math. OEL has also purchased the Spanish component solely for those 40 students enrolled in Dual Language Immersion classes.

Imagine Language & Literacy is an adaptive learning solution that accelerates reading and language proficiency for students in Pre-K. Designed to supplement core literacy instruction, Imagine Language & Literacy provides instruction and practice in all four domains of literacy—reading, writing, listening, and speaking. Development of both oral and academic language are essential to literacy. Imagine Math covers key skills to aid students in mastering essential concepts.

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What is Google Suite for Education?

All Atlanta Public School students have access to their own GSuite full of apps to engage your students in collaboration and productivity. To access this suite of Google applications, your student should open their Google Drive by clicking on the Google Drive app in myBackpack or by going to drive.google.com and entering in their APS login credentials. Once they are logged in, their Google Drive will open.



Let's take a closer look at their Google Drive:

- 1. "New" allows your student to create a new Doc, Sheet, Slide, etc.
- 2. This is where your student can access documents in their personal Google Drive or in "Shared Drives."
- 3. Quick Access provides your student with quick access to their most recently accessed documents.
- 4. Folders are where your student will be able to access the folders that they have created to organize their Google Drive. Folders can be color coded for further organization by right clicking on the folder and selecting color.
- 5. The "waffle" allows your student with access to their GSuite applications.





When your student clicks on the "waffle" on the top right hand corner of their Google Drive, a drop down menu will open. Students can access any of these applications by simply clicking on the application. A new, blank version of that document (Docs, Sheets, Slides, etc) will open and automatically be saved to their Google Drive. From there, students should title their documents and then begin working as instructed by their teacher.

Please note: Gmail is NOT available for APS students or teachers! Our email communication is Outlook.





Your student can also create a new Google Doc, Sheet, Slide presentation, etc by clicking on the "New" button on the top left hand side of their Drive. From there, a drop down will open. They can create a new folder here to organize their Drive, upload a file or a folder, and create new documents as needed. If they don't see the application that they are looking for (ie. Drawings, hover over the "More" option and an additional drop down will open.



Your child's teacher may use Google Classroom as their virtual classroom to create, distribute and grade assignments. Google Classroom streamlines the process of sharing files between teachers and students.

Students can access Google Classroom through <u>myBackpack</u> or by going to <u>classroom.google.com</u> and entering in their APS student login credentials. Google Classroom can be accessed through any device that has wifi including laptops, iPads, and cellular devices.

Students will join their teacher's Google Classroom in one of two ways:

- 1. With a join code provided by their teacher.
- 2. Their teacher will add them.

JOIN CODE:

Teachers will provide students with a "Join Code" to join their Google Classroom. Students will click on the "+" in the top right hand corner and then click "Join Class."



They will then be prompted to enter in the join code provided by their teacher. Once the join code is entered, they will click "Join" in the top right hand corner.

They now have access to their teacher's Google Classroom! Students will also see any other Google Classrooms that they have joined here as well.



TEACHER ADDITION OF STUDENTS:

If your student's teacher adds their students to their Google Classroom, when your child logs into Google Classroom, they will see the class in their dashboard of classes.

To join their teacher's classroom, your student will simply need to click the join button for that class. They will then be a part of that teacher's Google Classroom.

Your child's teacher may use Microsoft Teams as their all in one virtual learning hub. Microsoft Teams streamlines the classroom workflow by providing a digital OneNote Notebook for the class and a private notebook for each student. The teacher can add files, videos, educational tools/resources such as Nearpod, Flipgrid, and much more to the Teams platform.

With Microsoft Teams, active engagement, communication, and collaboration are front and center to the virtual classroom. Your child will never have to leave the Microsoft Teams platform to complete any assignment, every resource they need will be housed in the Teams platform.

A few features of Microsoft Teams that are helpful for virtual learning are:

- Sharing of assignments with instructors. ...
- Sharing of projects with other students. ...
- The ability to chat with instructors and fellow students. ...
- Virtual meetings for when you want or need that face-to-face interaction

Microsoft teams is available as an app on any mobile device (tablet or phone), laptop, or via a web browser.

Your child can access Microsoft Teams via myBackpack by clicking on the Office 365 icon and then selecting the Teams icon.





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Join a team with a code

Students will join Microsoft Teams in one of two ways:

- 1. Their teacher will add them. OR
- 2. They will use a **Join Code** provided by their teacher.

Your child can see all of their Teams by clicking on the Teams icon in the app bar.



Your child will need to click the appropriate Team and go to the correct **channel** to access the content provided by the teacher or to participate in live class sessions, discussions, or to complete assignments.

Microsoft 365 formerly known as Office 365 is the all in one cloud-based productivity platform that is **available for free for employees, teachers, and students of Atlanta Public Schools.** The Microsoft 365 suite of productivity and collaboration applications work on PCs, Macs, and iPads.

Microsoft 365 is home to many of the apps that students already know and use while at school such as Word, PowerPoint, Excel, Sway, Teams, OneDrive. Your child can now access these same productivity and collaboration apps at home during virtual learning. **Every APS student has access to five free downloads of the Microsoft/ Office 365 suite of tools.**

To get started follow these steps:

1. Access O365 via myBackpack.



2. Click Install Office and select Office 365 apps to download onto your device

CONTENT FILTERING FOR IPADS

Signing into Securly on an APS iPad

Once your iPad has been configured to use Securly for filtering, you must sign in to access the Internet. Follow the steps below to sign into Securly.

- 1. Reset iPad and connect to your home WIFI network. Go to Settings>General>Reset All Settings
- 2. Open the Safari and Chrome browser, and go to a website on the Internet.

You must sign into each browser. This is a one-time sign in unless the iPad has been reset. Browse to any internet site, <u>www.weather.com</u>, <u>www.wikipedia.org</u>, or <u>www.khanacademy.org</u> are sites that will work. You should see the Securly Account sign in page. **Select login with Google**.



3. On the next screen, you will be directed to the Google sign-in page. Enter your student Google account: <username>@apsk12.org. This is the same login that you use on your iPad for Google Classroom. Click Next.
