# Subject: COVID-19 Vaccinations, Testing at Douglass, AP Honor Schools, Air Purifier Donation, and Other Updates

## **COVID-19 Vaccinations and Staff Survey Deadline**

We were thrilled to hear the news about Governor Brian Kemp's plans to expand the list of people eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine to include teachers and school staff. The state has launched a pre-registration site for all Georgians at <u>myvaccinegeorgia.com</u>.

In the meantime, APS continues to work with the Fulton County Board of Health on future vaccination events for APS employees. As soon as we have a firm date for an APS vaccination event, we will let you know. But, we want to encourage everyone to get vaccinated. You don't have to wait for our APS vaccination event to get vaccinated.

Earlier this month, we sent you a brief survey to opt-in or out of planning through this partnership. Responding to this survey does not constitute consent for treatment, but if you opt in you will be contacted again when appointments are available and will be able to decide at that time if you want to take the vaccine. Please complete the survey by **5 p.m. today** so we can

### Drive-up & Walk-up COVID-19 Testing at Douglass High

I am proud that we launched a drive-up and walk-up COVID-19 testing site for our students, families, staff, and the community at Douglass High School this week. The District teamed up with some of Atlanta's leading healthcare organizations – Viral Solutions and pediatric researchers from Emory University and Children's Healthcare of Atlanta – to bring highly efficient drive-through PCR COVID-19 testing at no out-of-pocket expense to the entire APS family.

Our APS family also has the choice of being tested again at the same time, using new, emerging, easier, and simpler methods. This second free test will help researchers develop test-at-home technologies that will save lives – from Atlanta to all across the globe. Each person tested a second time receives a gift card, along with the assurance that they played a part in helping end this global pandemic.

The outdoor testing area is located on the north side of the building and will be open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday, through the end of the school year.

#### **State Names 2021 AP Honor Schools**

The Georgia Department of Education this week named the state's AP Honor Schools for 2021. As a state, Georgia's public school students for the Class of 2020 posted the 17<sup>th</sup>-highest Advancement Placement pass rate in the nation, according to College Board data. I am pleased that several of our high schools were highlighted for achievement, high levels of participation, access and support, and more.
