Construction of a recently completed APS school building earns a “Project Achievement” award from the South Atlantic Chapter of the Construction Management Association of America (CMAA)

ATLANTA – A new APS elementary school that recently open after completing construction earned an award and recognition from the South Atlantic Chapter of the Construction Management Association of America (CMAA).



The new E. Rivers Elementary School located in Buckhead received a Project Achievement Award at the organization’s annual banquet and awards ceremony held last night at the Georgia Aquarium in downtown Atlanta. The ninety-eight year old campus, the location of one of the oldest continuously operating schools in the district is now home to a new facility opened in January 2015 that was part of a \$28.0m project designed by Collins, Cooper, Carusi, Architects and built by the Parrish Construction Group.

The award was the fifth such award by CMAA to APS projects and was among several recognitions presented by the organization for 2015 and represent continuing industry acknowledgement of project achievements in the district's Capital Improvement Program.



The annual CMAA South Atlantic Chapter Construction Management Project Achievement Awards program recognizes outstanding achievement in the practice of construction management. The awards program is designed to recognize and promote professionalism and excellence in the execution and management of the building construction industry.
