By May 2017, for Math, 44% of students in the beginning level will move to the developing level, 41% of students in the developing will move to proficient level, and 14% of students will move to distinguished level.

Reading:

By May 2017, for ELA, 51% of students in the beginning level will move to the developing level, 32% of students in the developing will move to proficient level, and 15% of students will move to distinguished level.
